

AN ORDINANCE NO. 376.

Determining to proceed with the improvement of Mound Street from Pleasant Ridge Avenue to Euclaire Avenue by constructing therein a six inch (6) water main with necessary fire hydrants.

Be it Ordained, by the council of the Village of Bexley, State of Ohio:

Section 1. That it is hereby determined to proceed with the improvement of Mound Street from Pleasant Ridge Avenue to Euclaire Avenue by constructing therein, between the points aforesaid, a six inch (6) water main with necessary fire hydrants, and making water connections from said water main to the lots and lands fronting and abutting thereon, in pursuance of the resolution declaring it necessary to so improve said avenue, adopted on the 5th day of September, 1922, and in accordance with plans, specifications, estimates and profiles for said improvement, heretofore approved and now on file in the office of the village clerk.

Section 2. That all claims for damages resulting therefrom shall be judicially inquired into after the completion of the proposed improvement, and that the solicitor be and he hereby is authorized and directed to institute proceedings in a court of competent jurisdiction to inquire into such claims.

Section 3. That the whole cost of said improvement less one-fourth thereof shall be assessed by the front foot upon the following described lots and lands to-wit: Lots numbered four (4), five (5) and six (6) of Wells' Heirs' subdivision owned by J. P. and C. V. Mason and fronting three hundred and seventy (370) feet on the north side of Mound Street and lots numbered twenty-nine (29) and thirty (30) of Hamilton's Garden Addition to said village, except one hundred and fifty (150) feet off of the west end thereof, owned by F. C. McVay and fronting three hundred and ninety-three and sixty hundredths (393.60) feet on the south side of Mound Street.

Section 4. That the assessments so to be levied shall be paid in five equal annual installments, with interest on deferred payments at the same rate as shall be borne by the bonds to be hereafter issued in anticipation of the levy and of the collection of such assessments.

Section 5. That bonds of said village shall be issued in anticipation of the levy and of the collection of said assessments and in an amount sufficient to pay that portion of the estimated cost of said improvement hereinbefore determined to be specially assessed.

Section 6. That the remainder of the costs of said improvement to-wit: one-fourth shall be paid from the proceeds of bonds of said village, issued in the manner provided by law, or from the street improvement fund of said village.

Section 7. That the clerk be and hereby is authorized and directed to advertise for bids for the construction of said improvement according to law.

Section 8. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
