

AN ORDINANCE NO. 365.

To provide for the issue of bonds in anticipation of the levy and of the collection of special assessments for the construction of a six inch water main in Mound Street from Pleasant Ridge Avenue to Euclaire Avenue.

whereas, the Village Clark has certified to this council that the estimated life of the improvement proposed to be constructed from the proceeds of the bends hereinafter mentioned, is ton years, and has further certified the maximum naturity of such bends to be tim years, and

the payment of said bends and a tax to provide for any deficionsy in the lovy or collection of said assessments will first appear upon the duplicate for the tax year 1923, and that the final tax settlement with the County Treasurer next following the inclusion of such tax in the annual budget by the County Auditor as provided by law, will be obtained not earlier than the first day of September, 1925, and will require \$66.00 for interest until such assessment and taxes are collected and available.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it erdained by the council of the Village of Bexley, State of Chie:

Section 1. That bends of said village shall be issued in the aggregate gnount of \$1200.00 for the purpose of raising money in anticipation of the lovy and of the collection of special assessments to pay that pertion of the cest and expense heretefore determined to be assessed for the improvement of the love between Pleasant Ridge Avenue and Euclaire Avenue by constructing a water main with necessary fire hydrants therein in pursuance of the provide a fund for the payment of not to exceed one years and bends.

Section 2. Said bends shall be designated as "Mound Street" improvement Bends", and scriplly numbered from one (1) to five (5) both inclusive. They shall be of the denomination of \$250.00 each, bearing date of October 1st, 1922, and shall bear interest at the rate of five and one half (52%) per cent. per aroun, payable semi-annually on the first day of April and October of each year, for which interest coupons bearing the fac simile signature of the clerk of said Village shall be attached to said bends and made part thereof. Said bends shall fall due and be payable in the order of their serial number as follows, to-wit:

One bond of Two Hundred and Farty (\$250) Dollars on the first day of Ontober in each of the years 1925 to 1927, both inclusive.

Section 3.Said beads shall be megared by the Village Selicitor, signed by the Mayer and Village Clerk, and sealed with the seal of the Village of Bexley; they shall express upon their face the purpose for which they are issued, and the fact that they are issued pursuant to law, and this ordinance; they shall be payable, both principal and interest, at the effice of the Treasurer of the Village; and shall be issued and sold under the direction of the finance committee of this council.

Section 4. That upon the sale of said bends, any premium and accrued interest realized therefrom shall be paid to the sinking fund trustees to be applied to the payment of the principal and interest of said bends. The par value realized from the sale of said beads shall be deposited in the village treasury to the credit of the "Mound Street Improvement Fund" and shall be disbursed from said fund on proper vouchers in payment of that part of the cost of of the improvement aforesaid, heretofore determined to be especially assessed, and not to exceed one years interest on said bends, for which purpose said memory is hereby appropriated.

Section 5. That all installments of said assessments and all pertions thereof, tegether with interest thereon shall be applied to the payment of said bands and interest as the same become due, and to me other purpose whatever.

Section 6. That said bends shall be full general obligations of said village, and for the payment of the principal and interest of the same, the full faith, credit and revenues of said village shall be and hereby are pledged.

section 7. That for the purpose of providing the necessary funds to pay the interest and the principal of said bends promptly when and as they mature, and to create and maintain a sinking fund sufficient to discharge said bends at maturity, -there shall be and hereby is levied on all of the taxable property of said village in addition to all other taxes, a direct tax annually until the maximum date of maturity of said bends in an amount sufficient to provide for any deficiency in the levy, payment or collection of said assessments as they fall due. That said taxes shall be and hereby are ordered computed, certified, levied and extended upon the tax duplicate and collected by the same officer, in the same manner and at the same time that taxes for general purposes for each year are certified, extended and collected. That all funds derived from the tax levies hereby made, shall be placed in a separate and distinct fund, which together with all interest collected on the same, and is irreveably pledged for the payment of the interest and principal of said bends when and as the same

fall due.

Section 8. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
