AN ORDINANCE NO. 386.

To provide for the issue of bends in anticipation of the lovy and of the collection of special assessments for the construction of that part of the sanitary sewers in sewer district No. 5, designated and described in a resolution No. 304 declaring it necessary to construct said sewers adopted September 28th., 1922.

WHEREAS, the village clerk has certified to this council that the estimated life of the improvement proposed to be constructed from the proceeds of the bonds hereinafter mentioned, is 25 years, and has further certified the maximum maturity of such bonds to be 25 years, and

WHEREAS? this council estimates that the special assessments for the payment of said bends and a tax to provide for any deficiency in the levy or collection of said assessments will first appear upon the duplicate for the tax year 1923, and that the final tax settlement with the County Treasurer next following the inclusion of such tax in the annual budget by the County Auditor as provided by law, will be obtained not earlier than the first day of September, 1923, and will require \$426.25 for interest until such assessment and taxes are collected and available.

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the council of the Village of Bexley, State of Chie:

Section 1. That bends of said village shall be issued in the aggregate amount of \$15500.00 for the purpose of raising money in anticipation of the levy and of the collection of special assessments to pay that portion of the cost and expense heretofore determined to be assessed for the cost of constructing that part of the sanitary sewers in Sewer District No. 3 in said village to-wit: An eight (89) inch sewer in the first alley east of Cassady Avenue from Broad Street to Maryland Avenue; an eight (8") inch sewer in the first alley east of Ardmore Read from Broad Street to Maryland Avenue; an eight (8") inch sewer in the first alley east of Cassingham Road from Broad Street to Maryland Avenue; and an eight (8") inch sewer in the first alley north of Broad Street from Remington Read to Cassady Avenue, as pursuance of ordinance No. 354 determining to proceed with said improvement passed November 7, 1922; and to provide a fund for the payment of not to exceed one years interest on said bends.

District No. 3 improvement Bonds", and serially numbered from one (1) to Twenty (20) both inclusive. They shall be of the denomination of \$775.00 each, bearing date of April 1st., 1923, and shall bear interest at the rate of five and one half per cent (52%) per annum, payable semi-annually on the first day of April and October each year, for which interest coupons bearing the fac simile signature of the clerk of said village shall be attached to said bonds and made part thereof. Said bonds shall fall due and be payable in the order of their serial number as follows. to-wit:

Four bends of \$775.00 each, on the first day of agent in each of the years 1924 to 1928, beth inclusive.

Section 3. Said bends shall be prepared by the Village Seliciter. signed by the Mayer and Village Clerk, and sealed with the seal of the Village of Berb ley; they shall express upon their the purpose for which they are issued, and the fact that they are issued pursuant to law, and this ordinance; they shall be payable, both principal and interest, at the office of the Treasurer of the Village; and shall be issued and sold under the direction of the finance committee of this council.

Section 4. That upon the sale of said bends, any premium and accrued interest realized therefrom shall be paid to the Sinking Fund Trustees to be applied to the payment of the principal and interest of said bonds. The par value realized from the sale of said bonds shall be deposited in the village treasury to the credit of the "Sanitary Sewer District No. 3 Fund" and shall be dishursed from said fund on preper veuchers in payment of that part of the cost of the imprevement aforesaid, heretofere determined to be especially assessed, for which purpose said money is hereby apprepriated.

Section 5. That all installments of said assessments and all pertions thereof, together with interest thereon shall be applied to the payment of said bonds and interest as the same become due, and to no other purpose Whatever.

Section 6. That said bonds shall be full general shligations of said village, and for the payment of the principal and interest of the same, the full faith, credit and revenues of said village shall be and hereby are pledged.

Section 7. That for the purpose of providing the necessary funds to pay the interest and the principal of said bends promptly when and as they mature, and to create and maintain a sinking fund sufficient to discharge said bonds at maturity. there shall be and hereby is levied on all of the taxable property of said willings in addition to all other taxes, a direct tax animally until the maximum date of maturity of said bonds in an amount sufficient to provide for any deficiency in the kevy, pare ment or collection of said assessments as they fall due. That said taxes shall be said hereby are ordered computed, cortified, levied and extended upon the tax during the and collected by the same efficer, in the same manner and at the same time the taxes for general purposes for each year are certified. extended and coline to the all funds derived from the tax levies hereby made, shall be placed in a sept 100 000 distinct fund, which tegether with all interest collected on the same, and is desivocably pledged for the payment of the interest and principal of said brade where and as the same fall due.

Section 8. This ordinance shall take effect and be in female from and Stephen & June after the earliest period allowed by law. Passed Dw M 1641
