AN ORDINANCE MO. 392.

To provide for the issue of bends in anticipation of the levy and of the collection of special assessments for the improvement of Fair Avenue from Drexel Avenue to Belgard Lane.

WHEREAS, the Village Clerk pursuant to the provisions of Sections 2295-7 of the General Code of Chie, has certified to this Council that the estimated life of the improvement proposed to be constructed from the proceeds of the bends hereinafter mentioned, is 10 years, and has further certified the maximum maturity of such bends calculated in accordance with the provisions of sections 2295-9 of the General Code, to be 10 years, and

the payment of said bends and a tax to provide for any deficiency in the levy or collection of said assessments will first appear upon the duplicate for the tax year 1923, and that the final tax settlement with the County Treasurer next following the inclusion of such tax in the annual budget by the County Auditor as provided by law, will be obtained not earlier than the first day of September, 1924, and will require \$2,649.90 for interest until such assessment and taxes are collected and available.

NOW, THEREFORE; be it ordained by the Council of the Village of Bexley, State of Onio:

Section 1. That bends of said village shall be issued in the *SEGTOSATE amount of \$48,240.00 for the purpose of raising money in anticipation of the levy and of the collection of special assessments to pay that portion of the cost and expense heretofore determined to be assessed for the improvement of Fair Avenue from Drexel Avenue to Belgard Lane by grading, curbing and paving the readway with brick, asphalt, bitulithic, tarvia, concrete or some other form of permanent improvement; constructing sewers necessary to furnish proper drainage for said improvement; constructing a water main therein from Cassady Avenue to Belgard Lane and making water connections therefrom to the lots and lands fronting and abutting thereon in pursuance of ordinance No. 301 determining to proceed with said improvement passed September 20, 1921, as amended November 7, 1922, and to provide a fund for the payment of not to exceed one year's interest on said pends.

Section 2. Said bonds shall be designated as "Fair Avenue Improvement Bends," and serially numbered from one (1) to fifty-four (54) both inclusive, Ferty-five of said bonds shall be of the denomination of \$1,000.00 each, and nine of said bonds shall be of the denomination of \$360.00 each, bearing date of April 1.

1923, and shall bear interest at the rate of five and one-half (526) per cent per amoun, payable semi-annually on the first day of April and October each year, for which interest coupons bearing the fac simile signature of the Clerk of said village

snall be attached to and made part thereof. Said bends shall fall due and be payable in the order of their serial number as follows, to-wit: Fibe bends of \$1,000.00 each and one bend of \$360.00, on the first day of October in each of the years 1924 ac 1932 both inclusive.

Section 3. Said bands shall be prepared by the Village Selicitor, signed by the Mayer and Village Clerk, and seeded with the seal of the Village of Bexley; they shall express upon their face the purpose for which they are issued, and the fact that they are issued pursuent to law, and this ordinance; they shall be payable, beth principal and interest, at the effice of the Treasurer of the Village; and shall be issued and sold under the direction of the finance committee of this council.

Section 4. That upon the sale of said bends, any premium and accrued interest realized therefrom shall be paid to the sinking fund trustees to be applied to the payment of the principal and interest of said bends. The par value realized from the sale of said bends shall be deposited in the village treasury to the credit of the "Fair Areme Imprevement Fund" and shall be disbursed from said fund on proper venchers in payment of that part of the cost of the imprevement aferesaid, heretefere determined to be especially assessed, for which purpose said meney is hereby apprepriated.

Section 5. That all installments of said assessments and all pertiens thereof, tegether with interest thereen shall be applied to the payment of said bends and interest as the same become due, and to no other purpose whatever.

Section 6. That said bends shall be full general obligations of said williago, and for the payment of the principal and interest of the same, the full fair to Great and revenues of said village shall be and hereby are pledged.

Section 7. That for the purpose of providing the necessary funds to pay the interest and the principal of said bends premptly when and as they mature, and to create and maihtein a sinking fund sufficient to discharge said conds at maturity, there shall be and hereby is levied en all the taxable preperty of said village in addition to all other taxes, a direct tax annually until the maximum date of maturity of said bonds in an amount sufficient to provide for any deficiency in the levy, payment or collection of said assessments as they fall due. That said taxes shall be and hereby are ordered computed, certified, levied and extended upon the tax duplicate and collected by the same officer, in the same manner and at the same time that taxes for general purposes for eachyear are certified. extended and collected. That all funds derived from the tax levies hereby made,

shall be placed in a separate and distinct fund, which tegether with all interest collected on the same, and is irrevocably pledged for the payment of the interest and principal of said bends when and as the same fall due.

Section 8. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force

frem and after the earliest period allowed by law.
