

RESOLUTION NO. 336. ✓

Declaring it necessary to improve
Ardmore Road from Bread Street south
to Fair Avenue.

WHEREAS, the owners of three-fourths or more in interest of all of the lots and lands fronting, bounding and abutting on Ardmore Road, from Bread Street ^{to} Fair Avenue, in the Village of Bexley, Ohio, have filed with the council of said village their written petition for the improvement of said Ardmore Road by grading, curbing and paving the roadway, and

WHEREAS, by the terms of said petition, said owners consent and agree "That the entire cost of said improvement except only such portion thereof as is by law chargeable against the Village, may be assessed upon their respective properties and collected in equal annual installments in proportion to the whole assessment in the manner which may be fixed by the Council", and

WHEREAS, said owners also "consent and request that said assessments be levied and collected without reference to the value of their property and waive all benefits of the provisions of Section 3919 of the General Code limiting assessments to thirty-three and one-third per cent of the value of the property assessed for any and all purposes within the period of five years; and also waive all benefits of the provisions of Sections 3814, 3818 and 3895 of the General Code providing for the service and publication of notice of the proceedings for the construction of said improvement and the making and levying of the assessment therefor".

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the council of the Village of Bexley, State of Ohio:

Section 1. That it is necessary to improve Ardmore Road between Bread Street and Fair Avenue in said village, by grading, curbing and paving the roadway with brick, asphalt, bitulithic, tarvia, concrete or some other form of permanent improvement, constructing the necessary storm sewers to furnish proper drainage for such improvement, constructing a six inch water line with necessary fire hydrants in said road between Elm Avenue and said Fair Avenue, and making water connections therefrom to the lots and lands fronting and abutting thereon, in accordance with the plans, specifications, estimates and profiles of the proposed improvements prepared by the engineers of said village and now on file in the office of the village clerk, which plans, specifications, estimates and profiles hereby are approved.

Section 2. That the grade of said Avenue as improved shall be the grade shown by and upon the plans and profiles aforesaid, and the grade of the curbs shall be as follows, to-wit:

West Curb -

Beginning at the north property line of Fair Avenue, Station 0 plus 00, and elevation 109.85; thence northerly with a 0.20% descending grade to the south curb line of Dale Avenue, Station 5 plus 41.76, and elevation 108.73; thence northerly across Dale Avenue level to Station 5 plus 65.76; thence northerly with a 0.734% ascending grade to Station 8 plus 00, elevation 110.45; thence northerly with a 0.30% ascending grade to the center line of Powell Avenue, Station 15 plus 21.29, elevation 112.61; thence northerly with a 0.48% ascending grade to Station 20 plus 00, elevation 114.90; thence northerly with a 0.30% ascending grade to the south property line of Broad Street, Station 28 plus 00.79, elevation 117.30.

East Curb -

Elevation of each curb to be same as west curb.

Vertical curves to be used at changes in grade.

Above elevations refer to Village Datum.

Section 3. That the whole cost of said improvement, less one-fiftieth (1/50) thereof and the cost of intersections, shall be assessed in proportion to the benefits which may result from said improvement upon the following described lots and lands to-wit: All of the lots and lands bounding, fronting and abutting upon said proposed improvement, which said lots and lands hereby are determined to be specially benefitted by said improvement and in an amount equal to that part of the cost thereof hereby determined to be assessed thereon.

Section 4. That the assessments so to be levied shall be paid in not less than nine or more than ten equal annual installments, with interest on the deferred payments at the same rate as shall be borne by the bonds to be hereafter issued in anticipation of the levy and of the collection of such assessments.

Section 5. That bonds of said village shall be issued, in anticipation of the levy and of the collection of said assessments, in an amount sufficient to pay that portion of the cost of said improvement hereinbefore determined to be assessed upon the property fronting and abutting thereon.

Section 6. That the remainder of the cost of said improvements shall be paid from the proceeds of bonds of said village issued in the manner provided by law.

Section 7. This resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Case, whose places of residence are unknown, are hereby notified that on the 19th day of March, 1923, the council of the village of Bexley, state of Ohio, duly passed a resolution No. 356, to improve Ardmore Road from Broad Street to Fair Avenue by grading, curbing and paving the roadway with brick, asphalt, bituminous, tarvia, concrete or some other form of permanent improvement, constructing the necessary storm sewers to furnish proper drainage for such improvement, constructing a six-inch water line with necessary fire hydrants in said road between Elm Avenue and Fair Avenue, and making water connections therefrom to the lots and lands fronting and abutting thereon, in accordance with the plans, specifications, estimates and profiles of the proposed improvement, on file in the office of the village clerk.
