Declaring the amount of taxes that may be raised by the levy at the maximum rate authorized by law without a vote of the electors to be insufficient and declaring the expediency of a levy in excess of such rate and determining to submit such issue to a vote of the people at the November, 1923, election.

Be it resolved by the council of the Village of Bexley, State of Ohio:

Section 1. That the amount of taxes that may be raised by the levy of taxes at the maximum rate authorized by Section 5649-2 of the General Code within the taxing district of the Village of Bexley will be insufficient for the needs of said village and that it is expedient and necessary that taxes be levied on the taxable property in said city for a period of four years at a rate in excess of such maximum rate authorized by said Section 5649-2 of the general code.

Section 2. That it is expedient and necessary to levy taxes for the years 1923, 1924, 1925 and 1926 at the rate for each year of two mills on each dollar of the tax valuation of the taxable property within the Village of Bexley in excess of the rate authorized by said Section 5649-2 of the General Code for the following purposes, to-wit:

Health fund, public safety fund, public service fund, and general fund.

The form of the ballot shall be as provided in section 5649-5a of the general code of Ohio.

Section 3. That the village clerk be and he is hereby directed to certify a copy of this resolution to the deputy state supervisors and inspectors of elections of Franklin County, Ohio, in order that the said supervisors and inspectors of elections may make arrangements for submitting the question of said additional levy to the electors of said village at the election to be held on the 6th day of November, 1923, and that notice of said election shall be given by the mayor in the manner provided by law.
