

## AN CRDINANCE NO. 411.

Te previde for the issue of bends in anticipation of the levy and of the collection of special assessments for the improvement of Regington Read from Bread Street to the north line of lots 532 and 626 of ardmore Addition Number 2.

whereas, the Village Clerk pursuant to the provisions of sections 2295-7 of the General Code of Chie, has certified to this Council that the estimated life of the improvement proposed to be constructed from the provised of the bonds hereinafter mentioned, is ten years, and has further certified the maximum maturity of such bonds calculated in accordance with the provisions of sections 2295-9 of the General Code, to be ten years, and

WHEREAS, this Council estimates that the special assessments for the payment of said bonds and a tax to provide for any deficiency in the levy or collection of said assessments will first appear upon the the duplicate for the tax year 1923, and that the final tax settlement with the County Preasurer next following the inclusion of such tax in the annual budget by the County Auditor as provided by law, will be obtained not earlier than the first day of September, 1924, and will require \$2,722.50 for interest until such assessment and taxes are collected and available.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of the Village of Bexley, State of Ohio:

Section 1. That bends of said Village shall be issued in the aggregate amount of \$49,500.00 for the purpose of raising mency in anticipation of the levy and of the collection of special assessments to pay that portion of the cost and expense heretofere determined to be assessed for the improvement of Remington Road between Broad Street and the north line of lots 532 and 626 of ardmere Addition Number 2, by grading, curbing and paving the readway with brick, asphalt, bitulithic tarvia, concrete or some other form of permanent improvement, constructing sterm sewers necessary to furnish proper drainage for said improvement, and constructing a six inch water line with necessary fire hydrants, and making water connections from the

water line in said road to the lets and lands fronting and abutting thereon, in pursuance of Ordinance No. 401 determining to proceed with said improvement passed January 23, 1923, and to provide a fund for the payment of not to exceed one year's interest on said bends.

Section 2. Said bends shall be designated as "Remington Read interest Street Maprovement bends," and serially numbered from one (1) to fifty-four (54) both inclusive. Forty-five (45) bends shall be of the denomination of \$1,000.90.each and nine (9) bends of the denomination of \$500.00 each bearing date of April 1st. 1923, and shall bear interest at the rate of five and one-half (5-1/2%) per cent per annum, payable semi-annually on the first day of April and October each year, for which interest coupons bearing the fac simile signature of the Clerk of said Village shall be attached to and made part thereof. Said bends shall fall due and be payable in the order of their serial number as follows, to-wit:

Five bonds of \$1,000.00 each and one bend of \$500.00 on the first day of October in each of the years 1924 to 1932 both inclusive.

Seliciter, signed by the Mayer and Village Clerk, and sealed with the seal of the Village of Bexley; they shall express upon their face the purpose for which they are issued, and the fact that they are issued pursuant to law, and this ordinance; they shall be payable, both principal and interest, at the effice of the Treasurer of the Village; and shall be issued and seld under the direction of the finance committee of this council.

and accrued interest realized therefrem shall be paid to the sinking fund trustees to be applied to the payment of the principal and interest of said bends. The par value realized from the sale of said bends shall be deposited in the village treasury to the credit of the "The Reministen Read North of Broad Street Improvement Fund" and shall be disbursed from said fund on preper veuchers in payment of that part of the cost of the improvement aforesaid, heretofore determined to be especially assessed, for which purpose said meansy is hereby apprepriated.

Section 5. That all installments of said assessments and all pertiens thereof, tegether with interest thereon shall be applied to the payment of said bonds and interest as the same become 325, and to no other purpose whatever.

Section 6. That said bends shall be full general obligations of said village, and for the payment of the principal and interest of the same, the full faigh, credit and revenues of said village shall be and hereby are pledged.

Section 7. That for the purpose of previding the mecessary funds to pay the interest and the principal of said bonds promptly when and as they mature, and to create and maintain a sinking fund sufficient to discharge said bends at maturity, there shall be and nereby is levied en all the texable preparty of said village in addition to all other texas, a direct tax annually until the maximum date of maturity of said bends in an amount sufficient to provide for any deficiency in the levy, payment er collection of said assessments as they fall due. That said taxes shall be and hereby are ordered computed, certified, levied and extended upon the tax duplicate and collected by the same officer, in the same manner and at the same time that taxes er general purposes for each year are certified, extended and collected. That all funds derived from the tax levies hereby made, shall be placed in a separate and distinct fund, which tegether with all interest collected on the same, and is irreveably pledged for the payment of the laterest and principal of said bends when and as the same fall due.

Section 8. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the carliest period allowed by law.
