## AN CRDINANCE NO. 416.

Determining to proceed with the improvement of Bread Street between Cassady and Remiggton Read by constructing water lines therein.

so it ordained, by the souncil of the Village of Berley, State of Onio:

Section 1. That it is nereby determined to proceed with the improvement of Bread Street between Cassady Avenue and Remington Read in said village, by constructing an eight (8) inch water line on the morth side and a four (4) inch water line on the south side of Bread Street between said points, tegether with necessary fire hydrantes in pursuance of the resolution declaring it necessary to so improve said street, adopted on the 9th day of January 1923, and in accordance with plans, specifications, estimates and profiles for said improvement, heretofore approved and now on file in the office of the village clerk.

Section 2. That all claims for damages resulting therefrom shall be judicially inquired into after the completion of the proposed improvement, and that the selfcitor be and no neroby is authorized and directed to institute proceedings in a court of competent jurisdiction to inquire into such claims.

Section 3. That seventy per centum (70%) of the whole cost of said improvement including the cost of intersections, shall be paid by said village and the remaining thirty per election (30%) shall be assessed by the front feet upon the following described lets and lands to-wite Lets New. 2,7,8,9,10,15,16,17,18,31,32,33,34,35,36,37,38,39,40,41,42,43,44, and 45 of Ardmere addition New 2, all bounding and abutting upon said Broad Street between the points aforesaid, which said lets and lands hereby are determined to be specially benefitted by said improvement and in an amount equal to that part of the cost thereof hereby determined to be assessed thereon.

Section 40 That the assessments so to be levied shall be paid in five substantially equal chanal installments, with inverest on the deferred payments at the same rate as shall be berne by the bends to be nereafter issued in anticipation of the levy and of the collection of such assessments.

Section 5. That words of said village may be issued, in esticipation of the lawy and of the collection of said assessments, in end, amount sufficient to pay that perties of the estimated cost of said imprevenent nereinbefore determined to be assessed upon the premerty frenting and abutting taereen.

Section 6. That the remainder of the cost of said imprevement shall be paid from the presseds of bends issued by said village in the mouner provided by law.

Section 7. That the clerk be and hereby is authorized and directed to advertise for bids for the construction of waid improvement according to law.

Section 5. This extinance shall take effect and be in feres from and after the earliest period allowed by law-Passed \_\_April 24
