Previding for the issue of bends of the village of Bexley, this, for the purpose of paying the village's part of the cost and expense of compatructing certain sterm sewers.

issue his certificate as to the estimated life of the improvement proposed to be constructed in part from the proceeds of the bends hereinafter referred to, and said Clerk has certified to this Council such estimated life of said improvement to be twenty-five (25) years, and has further certified the maximum maturity of such bends to be twenty-five (25) years from the date of said bends, and

WHEREIS, this council estimated that a tax for said bends will first appear upon the tax duplicate for factor year 1923 and that the final tax settlement with the county Trensurer next following the inclusion of a tax for this issue in the annual budget by the County-Auditor, as provided by law, will be obtained not earlier than the first day of September, 1924, and will require \$715.00 for interest until such taxes are collected and available.

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of the village of Bexley. State of Ohio:

Section 1. That it is deemed necessary to issue the bends of the village of Bexley, State of Onio, in the principal sum of \$13,000.00 in order to prevides fund for the purpose of paying the village's part of the eyst of constructing certain branch drains or sowers for the purpose of furnishing surface and storm water drainage for that part of the territory in said village, bounded as follows:

Beginning at a point 160 ft. south of the south line of Charles Street and in the center line, produced southerly, of the alley between Reche Avenue and Pock Avenue; thence northerly with the center line of said alley and with said cether line produced to a point in the north line of Main Street; thence easterly with the north line of Main Street to a point where the same intersects the east corporation line; thence southerly with the east corporation line; thence southerly with the east corporation line to a point 160 ft. south of the south line of Charles Street; thence westerly and parallel to the south line of Charles Street and 160 ft. distant therefrom to the place of beginning.

and to provide a fund for the payment of not to exceed one year's interest on anid bonds.

principal sum of \$15,000.00 for the purpose aforesaid, said bends shall be designated as "branch sterm sewer bends" and sorially numbered from one (1) to fifteen (15) both inclusive; ten of said bends shall be in the denomination of \$1000.00 each and five (5) of the denomination \$500.00 each and shall be dated April 1, 1923, and shall bear interest at the rate of five and one-half (5½) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually, on the first day of April and October of each year until the principal sum is paid.

Interest coupons bearing the fac simile signature of the clerk of said village shall be attached to and made a part thereof. Said bends shall mature and be payable in the order of their serial number as follows:

Two bends of \$1000.00 each and one bend of \$500.00 on the first day of October in each of the years 1924 to 1928 both inclusive, which maturities are nerepy determined to be in substantial equal annual installments.

The principal and interest of all of said bends shall be payable at the effice of the Treasurer of said village.

Section 3. That said bends shall express upon their face the purpose for which they are issued; that they are issued in pursuance of this ordinance, and shall be signed by the Mayor and Clerk, and sealed with the corporate seal of said village.

Section 4. That for the purpose of previding the necessary funds to pay the interest on the foregoing issue of bonds promptly when, and as the same falls due and also to provide a fund sufficient to discharge the said serial bonds at maturity, there shall be and nereby is levied on all the taxable property in said village, in addition to all other taxes, a direct tax annually during the period said bonds are to run in an amount sufficient to provide funds to pay the interest upon said bonds as and when the same falls due and also to provide a fund for the discharge of the principal of said somial bonds at maturity, which tax shall not be less than the interest and sinking fund required by Section 11 of Article Xil of the Constitution of Ohio.

Said tax shall be and nereby is ordered computed, cortified, levied and extended upon the tax duplicate and collected by the same efficers, in the same manner and at the same time that taxes for general purposes for each of said years are certified, extended and collected. Said tax shall be

placed before and in preference to all other items and for the full amount thereof. The funds derived from said tax levies hereby required shall be placed in a separate and distinct fund, which together with all interest collected on the same, shall be irreverably pledged for the payment of the interest and principal of said bends when and as the same fall due.

Section 5. Said bends shall be seld in the manner provided by
law under the direction of the finance Committee and the Clerk, but not for
less than their par value and accrued interest; the proceeds from the sale of
said bends, except the premium and accrued interest thereon and the amount of
said bends issued for interest, small be used for the purpose aforesaid and for
no other purpose. The premium and accrued interest received from such sale and
the amount of said bends issued for interest shall be transferred to the trustees
of the sinking fund to be applied by them in payment of the principal and
interest of said bends in the manner provided by law.

Section 6. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
