

AN ORDINANCE NO. 419.

To provide for the issue of bonds in anticipation of the levy and of the collection of special assessments for the improvement of Bexley Drive from Main Street to the north line of the Columbus, Newark and Zanesville Electric Railway Company property.

WHEREAS, the Village Clerk pursuant to the provisions of sections 2295-7 of the General Code of Ohio, has certified to this Council that the estimated life of the improvement proposed to be constructed from the proceeds of the bonds hereinafter mentioned, is 10 years, and has further certified the maximum maturity of such bonds calculated in accordance with the provisions of sections 2295-9 of the General Code, to be 10 years, and

WHEREAS, this Council estimates that the special assessments for the payment of said bonds and a tax to provide for any deficiency in the levy or collection of said assessments will first appear upon the duplicate for the tax year 1923, and that the final tax settlement with the County Treasurer next following the inclusion of such tax in the annual budget by the County Auditor as provided by law, will be obtained not earlier than the first day of September, 1924, and will require \$643.50 for interest until such assessment and taxes are collected and available.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of the Village of Bexley, State of Ohio:

Section 1. That bonds of said Village shall be issued in the aggregate amount of \$11,700.00 for the purpose of raising money in anticipation of the levy and of the collection of special assessments to pay that portion of the cost and expense heretofore determined to be assessed for the improvement of Bexley Drive from Main Street to the north line of the Columbus, Newark and Zanesville Electric Railway Company property by grading, curbing, and paving the roadway with brick, asphalt, bitulithic, tarvia, concrete, or some other form of permanent improvement; constructing storm sewers necessary to furnish proper drainage for such improvement, constructing a six-inch water line with necessary fire hydrants, and making water connections therefrom to the lots and lands fronting and abutting thereon in pursuance of Ordinance No. 410 determining to proceed with said improvement passed March 13, 1923, and to provide a fund for the payment of not to exceed one year's interest on said bonds.

Section 2. Said bonds shall be designated as "Boxley Drive improvement bonds", and serially numbered from one (1) to Eighteen (18) both inclusive. Nine of said bonds shall be of the denomination of \$1000.00 each, and nine (9) shall be of the denomination of \$300.00 each, bearing date of five and one-half (5½%) per cent per annum, payable semi-annually on the first day of April and October each year, for which interest coupons bearing the fac simile signature of the Clerk of said Village shall be attached to and made part thereof. Said bonds shall fall due and be payable in the order of their serial number as follows, to-wit:

One bond of \$1000.00 and one of \$300.00 on the first day of October in each of the years 1924 to 1932, both inclusive.

Section 3. Said bonds shall be prepared by the Village Solicitor, signed by the Mayor and Village Clerk, and sealed with the seal of the village of Boxley; they shall express upon their face the purpose for which they are issued, and the fact that they are issued pursuant to law, and this ordinance; they shall be payable, both principal and interest, at the office of the Treasurer of the Village; and shall be issued and sold under the direction of the finance committee of this council.

Section 4. That upon the sale of bonds, any premium and accrued interest realized therefrom shall be paid to the sinking fund trustees to be applied to the payment of the principal and interest of said bonds. The par value realized from the sale of said bonds shall be deposited in the village treasury to the credit of the "Boxley Drive improvement fund" and shall be disbursed from said fund on proper vouchers in payment of that part of the cost of the improvement aforesaid, heretofore determined to be especially assessed, for which purpose said money is hereby appropriated.

Section 5. That all installments of said assessments and all portions thereof, together with interest thereon shall be applied to the payment of said bonds and interest as the same become due, and to no other purpose whatever.

Section 6. That said bonds shall be full general obligations of said village, and for the payment of the principal and interest of the same, the full faith, credit and revenues of said village shall be and hereby are pledged.

Section 7. That for the purpose of providing the necessary funds to pay the interest and the principal of said bonds promptly when and as they mature, and to create and maintain a sinking fund sufficient to discharge said bonds at maturity, there shall be and hereby is levied on all the taxable property of said village in addition to all other taxes, a direct tax annually until the maximum date of maturity of said bonds in an amount sufficient to provide for any deficiency in the levy, payment or collection of said assessments as they fall due. That said taxes shall be and hereby are ordered computed, certified, levied and extended upon the tax duplicate and collected by the same officer, in the same manner and at the same time that taxes for general purposes for each year are certified, extended and collected. That all funds derived from the tax levies hereby made, shall be placed in a separate and distinct fund, which together with all interest collected on the same, and is irrevocably pledged for the payment of the interest and principal of said bonds when and as the same fall due.

Section 8. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
