## AN ORDINANCE NO. 419.

To provide for the issue of bonds in anticipation of the lovy and of the collection of special assessments for the improvement of Bexley Drive from Hain Street to the north line of the Columbus, Newark and Zanesville Electric Railway Company property.

WHEREAS, the Village Clerk pursuant to the previsions of sections 2295-7 of the General Code of Onio, has certified to this Genneil that the estimated life of the improvement proposed to be constructed from the proceeds of the bends nereinafter mentioned, is 10 years, and has further certified the maximum maturity of such bends calculated in ascerdance with the provisions of sections 2295-9 of the Weneral Code, to be 10 years, and

WHEREAS, this Council estimates that the special assessments for the payment of said bends and a tax to provide for any deficiency in the levy or collection of said assessments will first appear upon the duplicate for the tax year 1923, and that the final tax settlement with the County Treasurer next following the inclusion of such tax in the annual budget by the County Auditor as provided by law, will be obtained not earlier than the first day of September, 1924, and will require \$643.50 for interest until such assessment and taxes are collected and available.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of the Village of Bexley, State of Chie:

Section 1. That behas of said Village shall be issued in the aggregate amount of \$11,700.00 for the purpose of raising money in anticipation of the lowy and of the collection of special assessments to pay that portion of the cost and expense heretofere determined to be assessed for the improvement of Berley Drive from Main Street to the north line of the Columbus, Newark and Zancoville Electric Rabiway Company property by grading, surbing, and paving the readway with brick, asphalt, bitulithic, tarvia, concrete, or some other form of permanent improvement; constructing storm sewers necessary to furnian proper drainage for such improvement, constructing a six-inch water line with necessary fire hydrants, and making water connections therefrom to the lets and lands fronting and abutting theorem in pursuance of Ordinance No. 410 determining to proceed with said improvement passed March 13, 1923, and to provide a fund for the payment of not to exceed one year's interest on said bends.

Section 2. Said bends small be designated as "nextley Drive improvement bends", and serially numbered from one (1) to Eighteen (18) beth inclusive. Eine of said bends small be of the denomination of \$1000.00 each, and mine (9) shall be of the denomination of \$300.00 each, bearing date of five and one-half (5%) per cent per annum, payable semi-annually on the first day of April and October each year, for which interest esupens bearing the fac simile signature of the Clerk of said Village shall be attached to and made part thereof. Said bends shall fall due and he payable in the order of their serial number as follows, to-wit:

One bend of \$1000.00 and one of \$300.00 on the first day of October in each

of the years 1924 to 1932, both inclusive.

Section 3. Said bends shall be prepared by the Village Seliciter, signed by the Mayer and Village Clerk, and scaled with the scal of the Village of Bexley; they shall express upon their face the purpose for which they are issued, and the fact that they are issued pursuant to law, and this ordinance; they shall be payable, both principal and interest, at the office of the Treasurer of the Village; and shall be issued and sold under the direction of the finance committee of this council.

interest realized therefrom shall be paid to the sinking fund trustees to be applied to the payment of the principal and interest of said bends. The par value realized from the sale of said bends shall be deposited in the village treasury to the credit of the "Bexley Prive imprevement fund" and shall be discursed from said fund on proper vousners in payment of that part of the cest of the imprevement aforesaid, heretefore determined to be especially assessed, for which purpose said memory is hereby appropriated.

Section 5. That all installments of said assessments and all pertions thereof, tegether with interest thereon shall be applied to the payment of said bends and interest as the same become due, and to no other purpose whatever.

Section 6. That said bends shall be full general ebligations of said village, and for the payment of the principal and interest of the same, the full faith, credit and revenues of said village shall be and hereby are pledged.

Section 7. That for the purpose of providing the mesessary funds to pay the interest and the principal of said bends promptly when and as they mature, and to create and maintain a sinking fund sufficient to discharge said bends at maturity, where shall be and hereby is levied on all the taxable property of said village in addition to all other taxes, a direct tax annually until the maximum date of maturity of said bends in an amount sufficient to provide for any deficiency in the lavy, payment or collection of said assessments as they fall due. That said taxes shall be and hereby are ordered semputed, certified, levied and extended upon the tax duplicate and collected by the same officer, in the same manner and at the same time that taxes for general purposes for each year are certified, extended and collected. That all funds derived from the tax levies hereby made, shall be placed in a separate and distinct fund, which tegether with all interest collected on the same, and is irreversably pledged for the payment of the interest and principal of said bends when and as the same fall due.

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Section 8. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
