AN ORDINANCE NO. 420.

To provide for the issue of bonds in anticipation of the levy and of the collection of special assessments for opening and extending Ardmore Read from Fair Avenue to the north line of let No. 1, of Joseph Rudelph's heirs partition.

WHEREAS, the Village Clerk pursuant to the previsions of sections 2295-7 of the General Code of Onio, has certified to this General that the estimated life of the improvement proposed to be constructed from the proceeds of the bends hereinafter mentioned, is 25 years, and has further certified the maximum maturity of such bends calculated in accordance with the previsions of sections 2295-9 of the General Code, to be 25 years, and

WHEREAS, this Council estimates that the special assessments for the payment of said wends and a tax to provide for any deficiency in the Levy or collection of said assessments will first appear upon the duplicate for the tax year 1923, and that the final tax settlement with the County Treasurer mext following the inclusion of such tax in the amnual budget by the County Auditor as provided by law, will be obtained not earlier than the limit day of September, 1924, and will require \$136.40 for interest until such assessment and taxes are collected and available.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of the Village of Bexley, State of Onio:

Section 1. That bends of said Village shall be issued in the aggregate amount of \$2480.00 for the purpose of raising mency in anticipation of the levy and of the collection of special assessments to pay that portion of the cost and expense heretofore determined to be assessed for opening and extending Aramere Read from Fair Avenue to the north line of lot No. 1 of Joseph Rudelph's noirs partition, in pursuance of Ordinance No. 358 determining to proceed with said improvement passed Aug. 22, 1922, and to provide a fund for the payment of not to exceed one year's interest on said bends.

Section 2. Said bonds shall be designated as "Ardmore Read extension bonds," and serially numbered from one (1) to eight (8), both inclusive. They shall be of the denomination of \$310.00 each, bearing date of April 1st, 1923, and shall bear interest at the rate of five and one-half (52%) per cent per annum, payable semi-annually on the first day of April 100 tober each year, for which interest coupons bearing the fac simile

part thereof. Said sends suall fail due and be payable in the order of their serial number as fellows, to-wit:

One band of \$310.00 on the first day of October in each of the years 1924 to 1931, both inclusive.

Section 3. Said wends shall be prepared by the Village Selicator, signed by the Mayer and Village Clerk, and sealed with the seal of the Village of Baxley; they shall express upon their face the purpose for which they are issued, and the fact that they are issued pursuant to law, and this ordinance; they shall be payable, both principal and interest, at the effice of the Treasurer of the Village; and shall be issued and seld under the direction of the finance committee of this council.

Section 4. That upon the sale of said bends, any premium and accrued interest scalined therefrom shall be paid to the sinking fund trustees to be applied to the payment of the principal and interest of said bends. The par value realized from the sale of said bends shall be deposited in the village treasury to the credit of the "Ardmere Read Extension fund" and shall be discursed from said fund on proper venchers in payment of that part of the cost of the improvement aforesaid, heretefore determined to be especially assessed, for which purpose said money is hereby appropriately.

Section 5. That all installments of said assessments and all pertions thereof, tegether with interest thereon shall be applied to the payment of said bends and interest as the same become due, and to no other purpose whatever.

Section &. That said bends shall be full general ebligations of said village, and for the payment of the principal and interest of the same, the full faith, credit and revenues of said village shall be and hereby are pledged.

pay the interest and the principal of said bends promptly when and as they mature, and to create and maintain a sinking fund sufficient to discharge said bends at maturity, there shall be and hereby is levied an all the taxable property of said village in addition to all other taxes, a direct tax annually until the maximum date of maturity of said bends in an amount sufficient to provide for any deficiency in the levy, payment or collection of said assessments as they fall due. That said taxes shall be and hereby are ordered computed, certified, levied and extended upon the tax duplicate and collected by the same officer, in the same manner and at the same time

for each me an critical extends of critical. Intelligents derive for the Tax levis that taxes for general purposes nervey made, shall be placed in a separate and distinct fundy which together with all interest collected on the same, and is irreveasely passed for the payment of the interest and principal of said bonds when and as the same fail due.

Section 8. This ordinance shalltake effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed for law.
