

AN ORDINANCE NO. 422.

To provide for and request the collection and disposal of garbage, effal, dead animals and condemned meat in the Village of Bexley, Ohio.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the village of Bexley, State of Ohio:

Section 1. That for the purpose of providing means for the collection, removal and disposal of garbage, effal, dead animals and condemned meats in said village the mayor be and hereby is authorized to purchase the necessary equipment therefor at a cost not to exceed \$1,000.00 and that the sum of \$1,000.00 hereby is appropriated from the service fund of said village to pay for the same.

Section 2. That the street Commissioner of said village be and hereby is authorized to employ an additional assistant who shall be assigned to the duty of collecting all garbage in said village disposing of the same in such manner as the Street Commissioner may direct. Such assistant shall devote as much of his time as is necessary to properly collect and dispose of such garbage and any remaining time shall be devoted to the performance of such work as the Street Commissioner may direct. The compensation of any such assistant shall not exceed the sum of \$125.00 per month.

Section 3. It shall be the duty of every resident house holder, tenant, hotel keeper, boarding house keeper, retail dealer, and all parties occupying dwellings within the village of Bexley to provide or cause to be provided, and at all times to keep or cause to be kept portable vessels or tanks for holding garbage or effal. Said vessels or tanks shall be perfectly water tight, with handles on the outside and provided with a tightly fitting cover, which shall not be removed except when necessary to place garbage or effal therein or remove the same therefrom. Said vessels or tanks shall be kept in the rear of the house or in the basement areas or passageways most accessible for the garbage collector and never upon the street, alley, sidewalk or other public place, and shall have a capacity of not to exceed two bushels. All such vessels or tanks shall be accessible to the garbage collector when called for and shall be replaced by him without unnecessary delay.

Section 4. The words "Garbage and offal" as used in this ordinance shall be held to mean and include all refuse accumulation of animal, fruit or vegetable matter from the kitchen, market or store, liquid or otherwise, that attend the use, cooking, dealing in, or storage thereof; and shall be held to exclude ashes, tin cans, discarded kitchen utensils, broken dishes, glassware and crockery. And it shall be unlawful for any person to place in said vessels or tanks anything except garbage and offal as herein defined.

Section 5. The assistant Street Commissioner assigned to the collection of garbage, offal and dead animals shall call regularly at all dwelling houses, boarding houses, restaurants, hotels, and retail dealers, and shall promptly and in a cleanly manner remove all garbage and offal offered and shall promptly return the can, receptacle or vessels to the premises from which they were received.

Section 6. The words "dead animals" as used in this ordinance, shall be held to include all animals which may have died from disease or accident; and the assistant Street Commissioner assigned to the collection and removal of garbage, offal, dead animals and condemned meat shall upon notice, remove and dispose of said dead animals, as soon as reasonably possible.

Section 7. Any person or persons who violate the provisions of this ordinance, shall for every such offense, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a fine of not less than five dollars nor more than fifty dollars.

Section 8. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
