AN ORDENANCE MO., 426.

To snow a Section One of an Ordiname see, 249 entitled An Ordiname "To Regulate the use of Meter Vehicles in the Village of Bexley" passed August 5, 1920. Be it ordained by the Council of the Village of Bexley, State of Chie; Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any one to operate a motor vehicle or motor epole on the public streets, reads or highways of said village at a speed greater than is reasonable or proper, maving regard for width, traffic, use and the general and usual rules of such street, read, or highway, or so as to endanger the preparty, life or limb of any person. A rate of speed greater than fifteen mildson neur is the susinessand elesely built up pertiens of the village, or more than twenty-five miles an hour in other pertiens thereof shall be presumptive evidence of a rate of speed greater than is reasonable or preper.

Section 2. Original Section One of said ordinance No. 249 horeby is repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
