

ORDINANCE NO. 428.

To submit to vote the question of annexation of the Village of Bexley to the City of Columbus, Ohio.

WHEREAS pursuant to ordinance heretofore passed by this council and by the council of the City of Columbus, Ohio, respectively, the Commissioners therein appointed have arranged the terms and conditions for the annexation of the territory of the Village of Bexley to the City of Columbus, and their report embodying the conclusions of said commissioners has been duly filed with this council, NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED by the council of the Village of Bexley, State of Ohio:

Section 1. That the question of the annexation of the territory of the Village of Bexley to the City of Columbus, Ohio, be submitted to the qualified electors of the Village of Bexley at the regular election in November, 1923.

Section 2. The question whether such annexation shall be made shall be put in the form of "Shall the Village of Bexley be annexed to The City of Columbus, Ohio," "Yes", "No", and printed on ballots, and those who are in favor of such annexation shall place a cross-mark after the word "Yes" and those who are opposed to such annexation shall place a cross-mark after the word "No".

Section 3. Ballot boxes shall be provided and votes counted and returned and the election conducted as regular municipal elections.

Section 4. The Clerk of the Village is hereby directed to publish this ordinance by posting copies of the same at least twenty days prior to the election hereby authorized, at five of the most public places in the corporation heretofore designated by ordinance of this council.

Said clerk is further directed to mail to each voter of this corporation at least twenty days before said election a printed copy of the terms and conditions of annexation as agreed to by the commissioners.

Section 5. This ordinance shall be in force and take effect from

Holbrook, Clerk of the Village of Bexley, State of Ohio, do hereby certify that there is no newspaper published in said said territory and that publication of the foregoing ordinance was duly made by posting true copies thereof at five of the most public places in said corporation as determined by the council, as follows: Main Street and Parkview Avenue, Main Street and College Avenue, Main Street and Broad Avenue, Broad Street and Canal Avenue and Parkview Avenue and State Avenue, each for a period of fifteen days commencing on the day of July, 1923.
