RESCLUTION MO. 404.

Declaring it necessary to impreve Fair Avenue from Belgard Lane to Hartley Read and to repeal Resolution No. 374, "Declaring it necessary to impreve Fair Avenue from Belgard Lane to Gould Read", adepted on January 8, 1924.

Section 1. That it is necessary to improve Fair Avenue between Belgard have and Hartley Read in said village, by constructing an eight (8) inch water line with necessary fire hydrants therein and making water connections therefrom to the lots and lands fronting and abutting thereon, in accordance with the plans, specifications, estimates and prefiles of the proposed improvements prepared by the engineers of said village and new on file in the office of the village clerk, which plans, specifications, estimates and prefiles mereby are approved.

Section 2. That the grade of said avenue as improved pursuant to this resolution shall be the natural grade shown by and upon the plans and profiles aforesaid.

Section 3. That the whole cost of said improvement, less one fourth (\frac{1}{4}) thereof shall be assessed in proportion to the benefits which may result from said improvement upon the following described lets and lands to-wit: All of the lets and lands bounding, fronting and abutting upon said proposed improvement, which said lets and lands hereby are determined to be specially benefitted by said improvement and in an amount equal to that part of the cost thereof hereby determined to be assessed thereon.

Section 4. That the assessments so to be levied shall be paid in five equal annual installments, with interest on the deferred payments at the same rate as shall be berne by the bends, to be nereafter issued in anticipation of the cellection of such assessments.

Section 5. That said village may berrow mency and issue notes due and payable not later than two years from the date of issue, in anticipation of the levy of said special assessments and of the issuance of bonds in anticipation of the collection thereof as provided in Section 3914 of the General Code of Chic. Said notes shall not exceed in amount that portion of the estimated cost of the improvement for which said special assessments are to be levied.

Section 6. That bends of said village shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of said assessments, in an amount sufficient to pay that pertion of the cost of said improvement nereinbefore determined to be assessed upon the property fronting and abutting thereon.

Section 7. That the remainder of the cost of said improvement shall be paid from the proceeds of bonds of said village issued in the manner provided by law.

Section 8. That resolution No. 394, "Declaring it necessary to impreve Fair Avenue from Belgard Lane to Gould Read", adopted January 8, 1924, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Sestion 9. This resolution shall taxe effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
