RESOLUTION NO. 416.

By Mr. F. H. Bennet.

Declaring it necessary to construct sanitary sewers in part of sanitary sewer District no. 4.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

That it is necessary to construct a certain part of the sewers provided for in a general plan for a system of sewerage for said village, which general plan was adopted by Council on the 11th day of June, 1910, and is now on file in the office of the clerk of said village and that the portion of the work provided for in said general plan, which it is hereby determined to construct, is as follows, to-wit:

An eight (8) inch sewer in the first alley east of Cassady Avenue from a point 45 feet south of Elm Avenue to south line of Bexley Place.

An eight (8) inch sewer in the first alley east of Ardmore Road from the first alley south of Broad Street to the south line of Bexley Place.

An eight (8) inch sewer in the first alley east of Cassingham Road from the north line to the south line of Bexley Place Addition.

An eight (8) inch sewer in the first alley south of Broad Street from a point 45 feet west of the west line of Remington Road to the intersection of said alley with the first alley east of Cassady Avenue, thence in the first alley east of Cassady Avenue south 27 feet to a man hole; and

A ten (10) inch sewer upon a sewer right of way off the south side of lots 6, 12, 16 and part of 24 Bexley Place and off the north end of lots 396 to 406 both inclusive of Bexley Park extension as they appear upon an auditor's Plat thereof and commencing at a point 37.63 feet east of the west line of said lot 406 and extending westwardly to Cassady Avenue.

The boundaries of that part of said District No. 4 so to be improved are as follows:

Being all the lots and lands bounding and abutting upon said proposed improvements except the following, to-wit: Lots Nos. 5 to 10 inclusive, of Rudolph's Fairwood Addition, Lots Nos. 1 to 6 inclusive of Bexley Park Addition and Lot no. 380 of Bexley Park Extension as same appears upon an auditor's Plat thereof, said lots so excepted being all the lots bounding and abutting on the east side of Cassady Avenue from Fair Avenue to Elm Avenue.

Be it further resolved that said sewers, together with the necessary house connections, shall be constructed in accordance with the plans and specifications on file in the office of the Clerk of said village and shall be of vitrified pipe.

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Be it further resolved that in accordance with the petition for said improvements filed by more than three-fourths in interest of the owners in property bounding and abutting upon said improvements, the entire cost inclusive of alley and street intersections shall be assessed in proportion to the benefits which may result from said improvements (except on the lots and lands bounding and abutting on the east side of Cassady Avenue between Fair Avenue and Elm Avenue) which said lots and lands are hereby determined to be specially benefited by said improvement in the amount of the entire cost thereof; and the cost of said improvement shall include the expense of preliminary and other surveys, of the printing and publishing of notices, resolutions and ordinances required, the serving of such notices, the cost of construction, together with interest on notes or bonds issued in anticipation of the collection of deferred assessments, and all other necessary expenditures.

Be it further resolved that the Clerk be, and is hereby, authorized to cause this resolution to be published in the manner provided by law.

RESOLUTION NO. 416.

Declaring it necessary to construct sanitary sewers in part of Sanitary Sewer District No. 4.

BE IT RESOLVED, By the Council of the Village of Bexley, State of Ohio:

That it is necessary to construct a certain part of the sewers provided for in a general plan for a system of sewerage for said village, which general plan was adopted by Council on the 11th day of June, 1918, and is now on file in the office of the Clerk of said village and that the portion of the work provided for in said general plan, which it is hereby determined to construct, is as follows, to wit:

An eight (8) inch sewer in the first alley east of Cassady Avenue from a point 46 feet south of Elm Avenue to south line of Bexley Place.

An eight (8) inch sewer in the first alley east of Ardmore Road from the first alley south of Broad Street to the south line of Bexley Place.

An eight (8) inch sewer in the first alley east of Cassingham Road from the north line to the south line of Bexley Place Addition.

An eight (8) inch sewer in the first alley south of Broad Street from a point 46 feet west of the west line of Remington Road to the intersection of said alley with the first alley east of Cassady Avenue, thence in the first alley east of Cassady Avenue south 27 feet to a manhole; and

A ten (10) inch sewer upon a sewer right of way off the south side of lots 6, 12, 18 and part of 24 Bexley Place and off the north end of lots 396 to 406, both inclusive of Bexley Place extension as they appear upon an auditor's plat thereof and commencing at a point 57.53 feet east of the west line of said lot 406 and extending westwardly to Cassady Avenue.

The boundaries of that part of said District No. 4 so to be improved are as follows:

Being all the lots and lands bounding and abutting upon said proposed

improvements except the following, to wit: Lots Nos. 5 to 18, inclusive of Rudolph's Fairwood Addition; Lots Nos. 1 to 6, inclusive, of Bexley Park Addition and Lot No. 386 of Bexley Park Extension as same appears upon an auditor's plat thereof, said lots so excepted being all the lots bounding and abutting on the east side of Cassady Avenue from Fair Avenue to Elm Avenue.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That said sewers, together with the necessary house connections, shall be constructed in accordance with the plans and specifications on file in the office of the Clerk of said village and shall be of vitrified pipe.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That in accordance with the petition for said improvements filed by more than three-fourths in interest of the owners in property bounding and abutting upon said improvements, the entire cost inclusive of alley and street intersections shall be assessed in proportion to the benefits which may result from said improvements (except on the lots and lands bounding and abutting on the east side of Cassady Avenue between Fair Avenue and Elm Avenue) which said lots and lands are hereby determined to be specially benefited by said improvement in the amount of the entire cost thereof; and the cost of said improvement shall include the expense of preliminary and other surveys, of the printing and publishing of notices, resolutions and ordinances required, the serving of such notices, the cost of construction, together with interest on notes or bonds issued in anticipation of the collection of deferred assessments, and all other necessary expenditures.
