WHEREAS, it has been determined by Council to assess the whole cost, less one-fiftieth thereof, in proportion to the benefits which may result therefrom of the following improvements, to-wit:

- 1. Stanwood Road from Broad Street to Fair Avenue, as provided by Ordinance No. 484, passed March 18th, 1924.
- 2. Broad Street from Remington Road to the east corporation line, as provided by Ordinance No. 482, passed March 18th, 1924.
- 3. Pewell avenue from Hartley Road to Gould Road, as provided by Ordinance No. 480, passed March 18th, 1924.
- 4. Reminsten Road from Broad Street to a point 160 feet south of Powell Avenue, as provided by Ordinance No. 482, passed March 18th, 1924.
- 5. Main Street from Vernon Road to Roosevelt Avenue, servovided by Ordinance No. 483, passed March 18th, 1924.
- 6. Hartley Road from broad Street to Fair avenue, as provided by Ordinance No. 491, passed april 8th., 1924.
- 7. Fair Avenue from Belgard Lane to Hartley Read, as provided by Ordinance No. 492, passed April 8th, 1924.
