

RESOLUTION NO. 436. ✓

Declaring it necessary to construct sanitary sewers in District No. 6.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That it is necessary to construct all of the sewers and the pumping station provided for in a general plan for the sewerage of the following described territory in the Village of Bexley, Ohio, known as Sewer District No. 6, to-wit:

Being the territory bounded on the south by the center line of Broad Street, on the west by Alum Creek, on the north by the north line of Clifton Avenue, and on the east by the west line of Bullitt Park Addition,

which general plan was adopted by Council on the 7th day of October, 1924, and is now on file in the office of the clerk of said Village; that it is hereby determined to construct all of the sewers provided for in said general plan for said Sewer District No. 6, bounded as hereinabove set forth.

Section 2. Be it further resolved that said sewer be constructed in accordance with plans and specifications on file in the office of the Clerk of said Village and shall be of vitrified pipe.

Section 3. Be it further resolved that the whole cost of said improvement, in accordance with the agreement heretofore filed by the owners of all the lots and lands bounding and abutting upon said improvement, shall be assessed in proportion to the benefits which may result from said improvement, upon the following described lots and lands, to-wit: Being all the lots and lands contained within the limits of said district, which said lots and lands are hereby determined to be specially benefited by said improvement, in an amount equal to the cost thereof, and the cost of said improvement shall include the expense of the preliminary and other surveys, the printing and publishing of notices, resolutions and ordinances required, the serving of said notices, and the cost of construction, together with interest on notes or bonds issued in anticipation of the collection of deferred assessments, and all other necessary expenditures.

Section 4. That the assessments so to be levied shall be paid in five annual installments with interest on deferred payments at the same rate that shall be borne by the bonds to be issued in anticipation of the collection thereof; provided that the owner of any property assessed may, at his option, pay such assessments in cash within thirty days after the passage of the assessing ordinance.

Section 5. That the bonds of said Village of Bexley shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of assessments by installments and in an amount equal thereto.

Section 6. Be it further resolved that the Clerk be, and he is hereby, directed to cause this Resolution to be published in the manner provided by law.
