Determining to proceed with the improvement of Remington Road from Broad Street to a point 160 source of Rosell Avenue.

Section 1. That it is never determined to proceed with the improvement of Remington Mosd between Broad Street and a point 160 feet south of Powell Avenue in said village by constructing a six (6) inch water line with necessary fire hydrants therein and making water connections from said water line to the lots and lands fronting and Abutting thereon in pursuance of a resolution No. 356, declaring it necessary to improve said road adopted January 8, 1924, and in accordance with the plans, specifications, estimates and profiles heretofore approved and now on file in the office of the village clerk.

Section 2. That all claims for damages resulting from said improvement shall be judicially inquired into after the completion of the improvement and the solicitor hereby is authorized and directed to institute proceedings in a court of competent jurisdiction to inquire into such claims.

Section 3. That the whole cost of said improvement, less one fiftieth (1/50) thereof shall be specially assessed in proportion to the benefits which may recult from said improvement upon the following described lots and lands to-wit: All of the lots and lands bounding, fronting and abutting upon said proposed improvement between the points aforesaid, which said lots and lands hereby are determined to be specially benefited by said improvement and in an amount equal to that part of the cost thereof hereby determined to be assessed \*hereon.

in five (5) equal annual installments, with interest on the deferred payments at the same rate as shall be borne by the bonds to be nereafter issued in anticipation of the collection of such assessments.

Section 5. That said village may borrow, and issue notes due and payable not later than two years from the date of issue, in anticipation of the levy of said special assessments and of the issuance of bonds in anticipation of the collection thereof as provided in Section 3914 of the General Code of Onio. Said notes small not exceed in amount that portion of the estimated cost of the improvement for which said assessments are to be levied.

Section 6. That bonds of said village shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of said assessments, in an amount sufficient of pay that portion

of the estimated cost of said improvement hereinbefore determined to be assessed upon the property fronting and abutting thereon.

Section 7. That the village's portion of the cost of said improvement shall be paid from the proceeds of bonds, issued by said village in the manner provided by law.

Section c. That the Clerk be and hereby is authorized and directed to advertise for pids for the construction of said improvement according to law.

Section y. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
