## Ordinance No. 491.

Determining to proceed with the improvement of Hartley Road from Broad Street to Fair Avenue.

Section 1. That it is hereby determined to proceed with the improvement of Hartley Road between Broad Street and Fair Avenue is said village by constructing a six (6) inch water line with necessary fire hydrants, and making water connections from said water line to the lote and lands fronting and abutting thereon in pursuance of a resolution No. 397, declaring it necessary to improve said road adopted January 8, 1924, and in accordance with the plans, specifications, estimates and profiles heretofore approved and now on file in the office of the Village Clerk.

Section 2. That all claims for damages resulting from said improvement small be judicially inquired into after the completion of the improvement and the solicitor hereby is authorized and directed to institute proceedings in a court of Competent Jurisdiction to inquire into such claims.

Section 3. That the whole cost of said improvement, less-onefiftieth (1/50) thereof shall be specifically assessed in proportion to the benefits which may result from said improvement upon the following described lots and lands to-wit: All of the lots and lands bounding, fronting and abutting upon said proposed improvement between the points aforesaid, which said lots and lands hereby are determined to be specially benefited by said improvement and in an amount equal to that part of the cost thereof hereby determined to be assessed thereon.

Section 4. That the special assessments so to be levied shall be paid in five (5) equal annual installments, with interest on the deferred payments at the same rate as shall be borne by the bonds to be hereafter issued in anticipation of the collection of such assessments.

Section 5. That said village may borrow money and issue notes due and payable not later than two years from the date of issue, in anticipation of the levy of said special assessments and of the issuance of bonds in anticipation of the collection thereof as provided in Section 3914 of the General Code of Chic. Said notes shall not exceed in amount that portion of the estimated cost of the improvement for which said special assessments are to be levied.

Section 6. That bonds of said village shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of said assessments, in an amount sufficient to pay that portion of the estimated cost of said improvement hereinbefore determined to be assessed upon the property fronting and abutting thereon.

Section 7. That the Virlage's portion of the cost of said improvement

shall be paid from the proceeds of bonds issued by said village in the manner pro-

Section 6. That the Clerk be and hereby is authorized and directed to advertise for bids for the construction of said improvement according to law.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
