## AN ORDINANCE NO. 494.

Determining to proceed with the improvement of Bexley Drive from the North line of the property of The Columbus, Newark and Zanesville Electric my. Co., said line also being the north line of the Mo. 1 of committees Subdivision to Livingston Avenue.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF ME VILLAGE OF BEALEY, STATE OF CAIO; Section 1. That it is nevery determined to proceed with the improvement of pexicy prive between the north line of the property of the Columbus newark and Expessible Electric My. Co., said line also being the north line of lot Mo. 1 of John Hikes subdivision and Livingston Avenue in this village, by grading, curping and improving the roadway with prick, asphalt, pitulithic, concrete, or same other form of permanent improvement, constructing the necessary storm sewers to furnish proper drainage for such improvement; constructing an eight inch samitary sewer and a six inch water line with necessary fire hydrants, in said drive between the points storesald, and making samitary sewer and water connections from said samitary sewer and water line to the lots and lands fronting and abutting thereon in pursuance of a resolution Mo. 366 declaring it necessary to improve said drive, adoptedDecember 11, 1923, and in accordance with the plans, specifications, estimates and profiles hereotofore filed with this council, and nevetofore approved.

Section 2. That all claims for damages resulting therefrom shall be judicially inquired into after the completion of the proposed improvement, and the solicitor hereby is authorized and directed to institute proceedings in a court of Competent Jurisdiction to inquire into such claims.

Section 3. That the whole cost of said improvement, less one-fiftieth (1/50) thereof and the cost of intersections shall be specially assessed in proportion to the benefits which may result from said improvement upon the following described lots and lands to-wit: All of the lots and lands bounding, fronting and abutting upon said proposed improvement between the points aforesaid, which said lots and lands hereby are determined to be specially benefited by said improvement and in an amount equal to that part of the cost thereof hereby determined to be assessed thereon.

Section 4. That the special assessments so to be levied small be paid in not less than him or more than ten equal annual installments, with interest on the deferred payments at the same rate as small be borne by the bonds to be mereafter issued in anticipation of the collection of such assessments.

Section 5. That said village may borrow and issue notes due and

payable not later than two years from the date of issue, in anticipation of the levy of said special assessments and of the issuance of bonds in anticipation of the collection thereof as provided in section 3914 of the General Code of Onio. Said notes shall not exceed in amount that portion of the estimated cost of the improvement for which said special assessments are to be levied.

Section 6. That bonds of said village shall be issued, in anticipation of the collection of said assessments, in an amount sufficient to pay that portion of the estimated cost of said improvement hereinbefore determined to be assessed upon the property fronting and abutting thereon.

Section 7. That the village's portion of the cost of said improvement shall be paid from the proceeds of bonds, issued by said village in the manner provided by law.

Section 8. That the clerk be and hereby is authorized and directed to advertise for pids for the construction of said improvement according to law.

Section 9. This ordinance shall take effect and se in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
