

## AN ORDINANCE NO. 507.

To prohibit the running at large of certain animals and fowls within the Village of Bexley, Ohio, and to repeal ordinance No. 2, passed October 13, 1908.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. Whoever being the owner or having the charge of any horse, mule, cow, sheep, goat, swine, dog, cat, duck, geese, chicken or any other fowl, permits the same to run at large in any street, lane, alley or other public place, or permits the same to go upon private ground not the property of such owner, or person having charge thereof, within the Village of Bexley, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than Five Dollars (\$5.00) nor more than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00), together with costs for prosecution.

Section 2. That ordinance No. 2, passed October 13, 1908, be and the same hereby is repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
