

AN ORDINANCE NO. 509.

To vacate part of the first alley east of Pleasant Ridge Avenue, in the Village of Bexley, lying immediately east of Lots numbers Seven and Eight (7 and 8) of Fred Michel's Subdivision.

WHEREAS, on the 10th. day of June, 1924, a petition by persons owning all the lots and lands abutting upon that part of the first alley east of Pleasant Ridge Avenue in the Village of Bexley, Ohio, lying immediately east of Lots numbers Seven and Eight (7 and 8) of Fred Michel's Subdivision, which alley is hereinafter more particularly described, was duly presented to Council, praying that said part of said alley be vacated, and

WHEREAS, all of said owners of property abutting upon said portions of said alley therein consent in writing that the same be vacated, and

WHEREAS, Council upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for said vacation as prayed for and that it will not be detrimental and ought to be made, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That that part of the first alley east of Pleasant Ridge Avenue, in the Village of Bexley, Ohio, which lies immediately east of Lots numbers Seven and Eight (7 and 8) of Fred Michel's Subdivision and which said part of said alley is more particularly described as follows:

beginning at a point 133 feet east of the east line of Pleasant Ridge Avenue, said point being the northeast corner of Lot no. 7 of Fred Michel's Subdivision; thence southerly with the east line of Lots nos. 7 and 8 of said Subdivision 108 feet to a point, said point being the southeast corner of Lot no. 8 of said Subdivision; thence easterly with the south line of said Lot no. 8 produced, 12 feet to a point in the west line of Lot no. 4 of Wells Heir's Subdivision; thence northerly with the west line of said Lot no. 4, 108 feet to the northwest corner of said Lot no. 4; thence westerly 12 feet to the place of beginning,

be, and the same is hereby vacated.

Section 2. That this ordinance be and remain in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
