

Ordinance No. 514.

Granting special permission to Rt. Rev. James J. Hartley, Bishop of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Columbus, Ohio, to erect a school in territory north of Broad Street and East of Alum Creek.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEAHEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That a special permit is hereby granted to Rt. Rev. James J. Hartley, Bishop of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Columbus, Ohio, to erect and use for school purposes, the buildings to be known as "St. Charles ~~Bartholomew~~ College-Seminary" on the tract of land in Class 1 of Single Family House District in the Village of Beahy as defined in Ordinance No. 406, upon the following described premises:

Being a tract of about twenty (20) acres of land bounded on the north by Clifton Avenue, on the east by the Cheek property, on the south by Broad Street and on the west by Alum Creek.

Said buildings shall be constructed of the heights, dimensions and in the locations designated on plans heretofore submitted to the building inspector and now on file in the office of said inspector; provided, however, no wall or fence of solid construction shall be erected to enclose said premises.


Section 2. That the Building Inspector is hereby authorized and directed to issue such building permit as hereinabove in Section 1 provided, upon payment of the fees in such case provided by ordinance.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
