

AN ORDINANCE NO. 516.

To accept deed of Mary Schnepferei of certain premises for alley purposes.

WHEREAS, Mary Schnepferei has executed her deed to the Village of Bexley, conveying certain premises for alley purposes, bearing date of July 21, 1924, said premises being particularly described as follows:

Being a part of Lot No. 3 of Joseph Rudolph Heirs' Partition in Marion Township, as shown upon the recorded plat thereof, as recorded in Plat Book No. 7, page 166, Recorder's Office, Franklin County, Ohio, and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the north line of said Lot No. 3, said point being in the east line of Rudolph's Fairwood Addition; thence southerly with the east line of Rudolph's Fairwood Addition 237.1 feet to a point in the south line of Lot No. 3; thence easterly along the south line of said Lot, 20 feet to a point; thence northerly and parallel with the east line of Rudolph's Fairwood Addition and 20 feet distant therefrom to a point in the north line of said lot; thence westerly with the north line of said Lot No. 3, 20 feet to the place of beginning,

said deed expressing consideration of One Dollar (\$1.00) and the benefits that will accrue to said grantor, and

WHEREAS, it will be for the best interest for the Village to accept said conveyance, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the deed of Elizabeth Rudolph, bearing date of July 21, 1924, conveying to said Village of Bexley, Ohio, the above described tract of land for alley purposes, be and the same is hereby, accepted, and the clerk is hereby directed to certify upon said deed the acceptance thereof by Council and to file same for record in the Recorder's Office, Franklin County, Ohio.

Section 2. This ordinance is to take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
