Authorizing the porrowing of money and the issuing of notes of the Village of Bexley, Only, in anticipation of the levy of special assessments for the construction of sanitary sewers in part of Sanitary Sewer District no. 4.

BE IT ORDRINGS OF THE COONCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF SECTED OF OR OR OF

Section 1. That the Village of Bexiey, this, we, and hereby is, authorized to porrow money in the sum of Eighteen Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$10,500.00) and to issue the notes of said Village therefor, in anticipation of the tevy of special assessments and issue of bonds in anticipation of the collection of said assessments, as provided by Section 3914 General Code, to pay the Costs heretofore determined to be specially assessed for the construction of samitary sewers in part of Samitary Sewer District No. 4 as follows:

An eight (o) inch lewer in the first alley east of Cassady Avenue from a point 45 feet south of Elm Avenue to south line of Bexley Flace.

from the first alley south of Broad Street to the south line of Bexley Place.

An eight (o) inch sewer in the first alley east of Cassingham Hoad from the north line to the south line of Bexley Place Addition.

An eight (o) inen sewer in the first alley south of Broad Street from a point 46 feet west of the west line of Remington Road to the intersection of said alley with the first alley east of Cassady Avenue, thence in the first alley east of Cassady Avenue, thence in the first alley east of Cassady Avenue, and

side of Lots 6, 12, 18 and part of 24 Bexley Park Place and off the north ends of Lots 505. 396 to 406, both inclusive, of Bexley Park Extension as they appear upon an auditor's glat thereof and commencing at a point 37.83 feet east of the west line of said lot 406 and extending westwardly to Cassady Avenue.

as provided by resolution No. 416, adopted May 13th., 1924, declaring the necessity therefore and in pursuance of Ordinance No. 512, determining to proceed with said improvement, passed July 8th, 1924.

each or soch smaller denominations as may be necessary, small be signed by the mayor, attested by the Clerk, be sealed with the seal of the viriage, poar date as issued, and small be due and payable not later than two years from nate of issue. Said notes shall be numbered from one (1) to nineteen (19) both inclusive, and shall bear interest at the lowest rate obtainable, but not in excess of six per cent (6%)

per annum, payable semi-annually. The proceeds of bonds issued in anticipation of the collection of the assessments and all of the assessments collected collected for said improvement shall be applies to the payment of said notes and interest thereon until both are fully paid, and thereafter said assessments shall be applied to the payment of said bonds and interest thereon.

Section 5. That the Finance Committee of this Council shall cause said notes to be properly prepared, executed and sold according to law to the person, persons, company or corporation offering the lowest rate of interest, and shall deposit the proceeds in the village treasury to the credit of the Sanitary Sewer fund.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
