

## AN ORDINANCE NO. 541.

Accepting deed of William A. Wharton and wife for Lot Number Twenty-nine (29) of George N. Tussing's Subdivision in the Village of Bexley.

WHEREAS, on the 7th day of October, 1924, the Council of the Village of Bexley found it necessary to purchase the real estate hereinafter described for the sum of Twenty-five Hundred Dollars (\$2500.00) and directed the Clerk, upon approval of the title to said premises by the Solicitor, to receive a deed of said premises, and

WHEREAS, said title has been approved by the solicitor and a deed executed by William A. Wharton and Laura A. Wharton, his wife, on the 28th day of October, 1924, conveying to the Village of Bexley, Ohio, said premises described as follows:

Being Lot Number Nine (9) of George N. Tussing's Subdivision of Lots Nos. 10, 11, 12, 13 and 14 of Wells' Heirs' Subdivision of Part of Half Section No. 20, Township 5, Range 22, Refugee Lands in Marien Township, Franklin County, Ohio, and also of a parcel of ground containing One and one-fourth acres adjoining the above named lots as said Lot Number Nine (9) is numbered and delineated upon the recorded plat of said Tussing's Subdivision, in Plat Book No. 5, page 74, Recorder's Office, Franklin County, Ohio, and

WHEREAS, it will be for the best interests of the Village to accept said conveyance, NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That said deed of William A. Wharton and Laura A. Wharton, his wife, bearing date of October 28th, 1924, conveying to said Village of Bexley, the above described tract of land be, and the same is hereby, accepted and the Clerk is hereby directed to certify upon said deed the acceptance thereof by Council and to file same for record in the Recorder's Office of Franklin County, Ohio.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
