AN ORDINANCE NO. 542.

Giving permission to The Ferrest Realty Company to construct a sanitary newer connecting Lets Numbers Four Hundred Seven (407), Four Hundred Eight (408) and Four Hundred Nine (409) in the parcel plat known as Bexley Park Extension with sanitary sewer new in easyment north of Fair Avenue.

Hundred Seven (407), Feur Hundred Eight (408) and Feur Hundred Nine (409) in a parcel plat knewn as Bexley Park Extension, located on the north side of Fair Avenue in Bexley, Onio, has petitioned for permission to construct a sanitary sewer connecting said lots with the sanitary sewer new in the easement north of Fair Avenue, a distance of about 190 feet and connecting same with the terminus of said sewer and has filed with Council a waiver in writing on behalf of itself, its successors and assigns, agreeing with the Village that it would make said improvements at its own cost under the direction of the Village engineers and that when said Village shall construct a trunk sewer in or near Gould Read for the benefit of the territory including said lots, that said above described premises may be assessed for their proper propertion of the cost of said trunk sewer and thereby waiving the right to claim exemption from such assessments on the ground that said premises already have or may have adequate sewer service, NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY? STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That said, The Ferrest Realty Company, in consideration of
said waiver and said agreement is hereby granted permission to construct said sanitary
sewer connecting same with the terminus of the sewer new in the easement north of
Fair Avenue for the sewerage of Lets Numberes Four Hundred Seven (407), Four Hundred
Eight (408) and Four Hundred Nine (409) in a parcel plat known as Bexley Park Extension,
said sewer to be constructed and paid for by said The Forrest Realty Company under the
direction of the village engineers.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
