AN ORDINANCE NO. 547.

Dellars (\$2500.00).

Te fix the salaries, compensation and bends of Village Officials and employes and to repeal Ordinances No. 459, passed Nevember 27th, 1923, and No. 493, passed April 15th, 1924, Respectively.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO: Section 1. That the salary of the Mayor of the village shall be One Mundred Dellars (\$100.00) per annum, in addition to the fees and other compensation new or nereafter provided by law, and he shall give bend in the sum of Five Hundred Dellars (\$500.00).

Hundred Dellars (\$1500.00) per annum for all services rendered as atterney and Counsel for the village and the efficials thereof in their efficial capacity, provided however, said Selicitor shall not be required to render any service to said village or efficials in any lititated matters for the salary and compensation aforesaid, but, in case his services should be required by said Village or efficials in any case or cases wherein the Village is involved or about to be involved in lititation, he shall receive for such services such sum or sums as may be agreed upon by such Selicitor and the Council. The Selicitor shall give bend in the sum of five Hundred Dellars (\$500.00).

Section 5. That the salary of the Building Inspector shall be Eighteen Hundred Dellars (\$1800.00) per annum.

Section 6. The salary of the Marshall shall be in the sum of Fifty Dellars (\$50.00) per annum, in addition to such fees as are allowed by law, and he shall give bend in the sum of Five Hundred Dellars (\$500.00).

Section 7. That the salary of the deputy marshall shall be One Hundred Fifty Dellars (\$150.00) per menth while acting as such as previded by Ordinance No. 339, passed April 26th, 1922, and Ordinance No. 346, passed June 6th, 1922.

Section 8. The salary of the Street Commissioner shall be
Two Thousand Fifty Dollars (\$2050.00) per annum; that the compensation of one
assistant Street Commissioner shall be at the rate of Sixteen Hundred and Twenty Dollars

per annum while centinuously employed; the compensation of common laborers shall be not to exceed Sixty-five Cents (65c) per hour; the compensation for each team and driver employed by said Street Commissioner shall be not to exceed One Dellar (\$1.00) per hour; said Street Commissioner shall give bend in the sum of Five Hundred Dellars (\$500.00).

Section 9. There shall be a clerk of the Trustees of the Sinking Fund and his salary shall be Six Hundred Dellars (\$600.00) per annum. He shall give bend in the sum of Twenty-five Thousand Five Hundred Dellars (\$25,500.00), as provided by law.

Section 10. The clerk of the Board of Trustees of Public Affairs shall devote his entire time to the business of Public Affairs and his salary shall he Twenty-one Hundred Dellars (\$2100.00) per annum. He shall give bend in the sum of Three Thousand Dellars (\$3,000).

Section 11. The compensation of each member of the village council shall be Two Dellars: (\$2.00) for each and every meeting of the Council, whether the same be a regular, adjourned or called meeting, provided said meetings shall not exceed twenty-four in any year, and provided further that no member of the council shall receive any compensation whatever for any meetings of the council which he does not attend, and answer to his name on roll call, as shown by the minutes of the clerk.

Section 12. That the salaries and compensation of each of the above named officials and members of the council of the Village shall be paid quarterly, except the salaries of the clerk, Deputy Clerk, Clerk of the Board of Trustees of Public affairs, Clerk of the Trustees of the Sinking Fund, the Building Inspector, Street Commissioner, Assistant to the Street Commissioner, the Deputy Marshall, and Solicitor which shall be paid menthly, out of the village treasury after the same has become due, and the clerk and treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to pay said salaries and compensation, when due as herein provided without other action of the council thereon.

Section 13. That Ordinance No. 459 heretofore passed on November 27th, 1923, and ordinance No. 493, passed on the 15th day of April, 1924, be, and the same are hereby, repealed.

Section 14. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
