AN ORDINANCE NO. 581.

Determining to proceed with the construction of sanitary sewers in part of Sanitary Sewer District No. 4.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That it is hereby determined to proceed with the construction of parts hereinafter described of the sanitary sewers provided for in a general plan for a system of sewerage for said Village of Bexley, which general plan was adopted by Council of the 11th day of June, 1918, and is now on file in the office of the Clerk of said Village; that the portion of the work provided for in said general plan which it is hereby determined to construct, are as follows, to-wit: The sanitary sewers shown upon the plan of said Sewer District No. 4. as follows:

- (a) An eight (8) inch sewer in Charles Street from the present trunk sewer in the first alley west of Euclaire Avenue to the first alley west of Roche Avenue.
- (b) An eight (f) inch sewer in the first alley west of Montrose Avenue from Charles Street to a point 65 feet south of the south property line of the first alley south of Main Street.
- (c) An eight (8) inch sewer in the first alley west of Roche Avenue from Charles Street to a point 25 feet south of the south property line of Astor Avenue.
- (d) an eight (8) inch sewer in the first alley north of Livingston Avenue from a point 40 feet west of the west line of Roche Avenue; thence westerly to the center line of the first alley west of Roche Avenue; thence northerly in said first alley west of Roche Avenue to Charles Street.

The boundaries of that part of said District No. 4. so to be improved are described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the intersection of Roche Avenue and Livingston Avenue, said point being the south east corner of said Sanitary Sewer District No. 4; thence westerly with the south line of said district 311 feet to a point; thence northerly and parallel with the east line of said District and 311 feet therefrom to a point, said point being 50 feet south of the south property line of Charles Street; thence westerly and parallel with the south line of Charles Street and 50 feet distant therefrom to a

point in the a

point in the east line of Bexley Plaza Extension Addition; thence notherly with the east line of said Addition to the center line of Charles Street; thence westerly with the center line of Charles Street to the east property line of Euclaire Avenue; thence northerly with the east line of Havenuvord Bruve; thence easterly with the center line thereof to the center line of Cassingham Road; thence northerly with the line of said Cassingham Road to the intersection of said center line with the south line produced of Lot Number One Hundred Eleven (111) of Bexley Plaza Addition; thence easterly with the south line of Lots Numbers One Hundred Eleven (111) and One Hundred twelve (112) of said Addition to the center line of Montrose Avenue. thence southerly with the center line of Montrose Avenue to the center line of Mound Street; thence easterly with the center line of Mound Street to the center line of Roche Avenue; thence southerly with the centerlline of Roche Avenue to the place of beginning.

Section 2. Said sewers, together with the necessary house connections for each lot fronting and abutting upon said improvement shall be constructed pursuant to Resolution No. 442, adopted January 27th, 1925, and in accordance with the plans and specifications heretofore prepared by the engineer of said Village and now on file in the office of the Clerk of said Village and said sewers shall be of vitrified pipe.

Section 3. That the entire cost of said improvement, less one-fiftieth (1/50) thereof shall be assessed in proportion to the benefits which may result from said improvement upon all the lots and lands bounding and abutting upon said improvement, which said lots and lands are nereby determined to be specially benefited by said improvement and the cost of said improvement shall include the expense of preliminary and other surveys, the printing and publishing of notices, resolutions and ordinances required, the serving of such notices, the cost of construction, together with interest on notes or bonds issued in anticipation of the collection of deferred assessments and all other necessary expenditures.

Section 4. That the assessments so levied shall be paid in five equal annual installments, with interest on deferred payments at the rate of 6% per annum; provided that the owner of any property assessed, may at his option, pay such assessment in cash within thirty days after the passage of the assessment ordinance, upon due notice being given.

Section 5. That bonds shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of said assessments by installments, in an amount equal thereto.

Section 6. That the clerk be, and hereby is, authorized to advertise for bids for the construction of said improvement as provided by law.

Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
