

## AN ORDINANCE NO. 613

Authorizing the borrowing of money and the issuing of notes of the Village of Bexley, Ohio, in anticipation of the levy of special assessments for the improvement of certain streets and avenues in the Village of Bexley, by constructing water lines therein with necessary fire hydrants and water connections.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Village of Bexley be, and hereby is authorized to borrow money in the sum of Eleven Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars (\$11,700.00) and to issue the notes of said Village therefor, in anticipation of the levy of special assessments and the issuing of bonds in anticipation of the collection of said assessments as provided by Section 3914 General Code, to pay the costs heretofore determined to be specially assessed for the improvement of the following streets and avenues in said Village of Bexley, by constructing water lines therein between Caroline Avenue and Delmar Drive as follows, to-wit:

Drexel Avenue, by constructing a six (6) inch water line therein; Walnut Street, by constructing a six (6) inch water line therein; Dawson Avenue by constructing a six (6) inch water line therein; Cassady Avenue, by constructing a twelve (12) inch water line therein; Also a six (6) inch water line in Delmar Drive connecting said above mains with existing main now in Columbia Avenue, also constructing the necessary fire hydrants and making water connections to the lots and lands fronting and abutting upon said lines as provided by Resolution No. 459, declaring the necessity therefor, adopted April 28th, 1925, and in pursuance of an Ordinance No. 607, determining to proceed with said improvement, passed May 26th, 1925.

Section 2. That said notes shall be in denominations of One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00) each, or any multiple thereof, or such smaller denomination as may be necessary, shall be signed by the Mayor, attested by the Clerk, be sealed with the seal of the Village, bear date as issued and shall be due and payable not later than two years from date of issue. Said notes shall be numbered consecutively beginning with number one (1) and shall bear interest at the lowest rate obtainable, but not in excess of 6% per annum, payable semi-annually. The proceeds of the bonds issued in anticipation of the collection of the assessments, and all of the assessments collected for said improvement, shall

be applied to the payment of said notes and interest thereon until both are fully paid, and thereafter said assessments shall be applied to the payment of said bonds and interest thereon.

Section 3. That the Finance Committee of this Council shall cause said notes to be properly prepared, executed and sold according to law to the person, persons, company or corporation offering the lowest rate of interest, and shall deposit the proceeds in the Village Treasury to the credit of Sundry Sewer Improvement Fund.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
