

AN ORDINANCE NO. 615.

To remit special assessments levied for the improvement of Cassingham Road on Lots Nos. 69 and 70 of Rudolph's Fairwood Addition to the Village of Bexley, purchased by the Board of Education of the Bexley School District.

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Bexley School District has purchased and become the owner of Lots Nos. 69 and 70 of Rudolph's Fairwood Addition to the Village of Bexley, which lots have heretofore been specially assessed by Ordinance No. 650, duly passed January 13th, 1925, in the sum of \$522.47 each and upon which amount against each lot there is now owing interest in the sum of \$14.37, and

WHEREAS, said Board of Education has requested that said assessments and interest be remitted and withdrawn from said lots and Council is of the opinion that said request should be granted and said assessments remitted, THEREFORE:


BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the special assessment for the improvement of Cassingham Road against Lots Nos. 69 and 70 of Rudolph's Fairwood Addition in the sum of \$522.47 and interest against each lot be, and the same hereby are, remitted and withdrawn and the Auditor of Franklin County, Ohio, is authorized to cause same to be cancelled and withdrawn from the Duplicates of Franklin County, Ohio.

Section 2. That the Clerk be, and hereby is, directed to certify a copy of this ordinance to the Auditor of Franklin County, Ohio.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
