AN ORDINANCE NO. 652.

By Mr. Lowrie.

To fix the salaries, compensation and bonds of Village Officials and employes and to repeal Ordinance No. 459, passed November 27th, 1923, No. 493, passed April 15th, 1924, and No. 547, passed December 9th, 1925, respectively.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BELLEY? STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the salary of the Mayor of the Village shall be One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per annum, in addition to the fees and other compensation now or hereafter provided by law, and he shall give bond in the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00).

Section 2. That the salary of the Clerk shall be One Thousand Dollars

(41,000.00) per annum and the compensation of a deputy clerk shall be

Dollars per month and each shall give bond in the Five Hundred

Dollars (4500.00).

Section 3. That the salary of the The Abil be Two Hundred.

Forty Dollars (\$240.00) per annum, and he shall give lond in the sum of Twenty-five Hundred Lollars (\$2,500.00).

Dollars (\$1,500.00) per annum for all services rendered as attorney and counsel for the village and the officials thereof in their official copacity, provided however, said solicitor shall not be required to render any service to said village or officials in any litigated matters for the salary and compensation aforesaid, but, in case his services should be required by said village or officials in any case or cases wherein the Virlage is involved or about to be involved in his gation, he shall receive for such services such sum or sums as may be agreed when by such Solicitor and the council. The Solicitor shall give bond in the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00).

Section 5. That the calary of the Building Inspector shall be Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) per annum.

Section 6. That the salary of Marshal shall in the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) per annum, in addition to such fees as are allowed by law, and he shall give bond in the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00).

Section 7. That the salary of the Deputy Marshals shall be One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$150.00) per month while acting as such as provided by Ordinance No. 339, passed April 26th, 1922, and Ordinance No. 346, passed June 6th, 1922, and Ordinance No. 639, passed September 22nd, 1925.

Section 8. That the salary of the Street Commissioner shall be Two
Thousand Three Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$2.350.00) per annum; that the compensation
of one Assistant Street Commissioner shall be at the rate of Seventeen Hundred
and Forty Dollars (\$1,740.00) per annum; while continuously employed; the compensation of common laborers shall be not to exceed Sixty-five cents (65c) per
hour; the compensation for each team and driver employed by said Street Commissioner shall be not to exceed One Dollar (\$1.00) per hour; said Street Commissioner
shall give bond in the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00).

Section 9. That the salary of the Garbage Collector shall be One Hundred Ten Dollars (\$110.00) per month while acting as such.

Section 10. There shall be a clerk of the Trustees of the Sinking Fund and his salary shall be Seven Hundred Twenty Dollars (\$720.00) per annum. He shall give bond in the sum of Twenty-Five Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$25,500). as provided by law.

Section 11. The compensation of each member of the pourd of Trustees of Public affairs shall be Two Dollars (\$2.00) for each and every meeting of the Board, whether the same be a regular, adjourned or called meetings provided said meetings shall not exceed twenty-four in any year, and provided further whatever that no member of the Board shall receive any compensation#for any meetings of the Board which he does intattend, and each member shall give and in the sum of \$1,000.00; the Clerk of the Board of Trustees of Public Affairs shall devote his entire time to the business of Public Affairs and his salary shall be Twenty Four Hundred Dollars (\$2,400.00) per annum. He shall give bond in the sum of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00).

Section 12. The compensation of each member of the Village Council shall be Two Dollars (\$2.00) for each and every meeting of the Council, whether the same be a regular, adjourned or called meeting, provided said meetings shall not easeed twenty-four in any year, and provided further that no member of the council chall receive any compensation whatever for any meetings of the Council which he does not attend, and answer to his name on roll call, as shown by the minutes of the clerk.

Section 13. That the salaries and compensation of each of the grand criticials and members of the council of the Village shall be paid quarterly, except the salaries of the clerk, deputy clerk, clerk of the Board of Trustees of Public Affairs, Clerk of the Trustees of the Sinking Fund, The Building Inspector, Street Commissioner, Assistant to the Street Commissioner, Garbage

Collector, The Deputy Marshals, and Solicitor which shall be paid monthly, out of the Village Treasury after the same has become due, and the Clerk and Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to pay said salaries and compensation, when due as herein provided without other action of the council thereon.

Section 14. That Ordinance No. 459 heretofore passed on November 27th, 1923, Ordinance No. 493, passed on the 15th day of April, 1924, and Ordinance No. 547, passed December 9th, 1924, be and the same are hereby, repealed.

Section 15. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
