AN ORDINANCE NO. 693

By Mr. Manly.

Determining to proceed with the construction of sanitary sewers in part of Sanitary Sewer District No. 3.

BE IT ORDAINE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That it is hereby determined to proceed with the construction of a part hereinafter described of sanitary sewers provided for in a general plan for a system of sewerage for said Village, which general plan was heretofore adopted by Council and is now on file in the office of the Clerk of said Village; that the portions of the work provided for in said general plan which it is hereby determined to construct are as follows, to-wit: the sanitary sewers shown upon the plan of said Sewer District No. 3 as follows:

- (a) An eight (8), sen (10) and twelve (12) inch sewer in Maryland Avenue from the present sanitary sewer in Stanbery Avenue to the first alley east of Ardmore Boad.
- (%) An eight (8) inch sewer in the first alley east of Ardmore Road from Maryland Avenue to a point 45 feet couth of the south line of Ruhl Avenue.
- (c) An eight (b) and ten (10) inch sewer in the first alley east of Cassady hoad from Maryland Avenue to a point 15 feet north of the south line of Lot No. 463 Bellwood Addition.
- (d) An eight (8) inch sewer in the first alley north of Ruhl Avenue from the first alley east of Cassady Avenue to a point 25 feet west of the west line of Spruce Street.
- (e) An eight (8) inch sewer in the first alley north of Columbus Avenue from the first alley east of Cassady Avenue to a point 25 feet west of the west line of Spruce Street.
- (f) An eight (8) inch sewer in the first alley north of Bellwood Avenue from the first alley east of Cassady Avenue to a point 25 feet west of the west line of Spruce Street.
- (g) An eight (8) inch sewer in the first alley north of Allegheny Avenue from the first alley east of Cassady Avenue to a point 25 feet west of the west line of Spruce Street.

That part of said sewer district so to be improved being all the lots bounding, abutting and fronting upon said improvement.

Section 2. The t said sewers, together with the necessary house connections for each lot fronting and abutting upon said improvement shall be constructed pursuant to Resolution No. 522, adopted January 12th, 1926, and in accordance with

the plans and specifications heretofore prepared by the engineer of said Village and now on file in the office of the Clerk of said Village and said sewer shall be of itrified pipe.

Section 3. That the entire cost of said improvement, in accordance with the petition heretofore filed for said improvement of the property owners abutting thereon, shall be assessed in proportion to the benefits which may result from said improvement upon all the lots and lands bounding and abutting upon said improvement, which said lots and lands are hereby determined to be specially benefited by said improvement and the cost of said improvement shall include the expense of preliminary and other surveys, the printing and publishing of notices, resolutions and ordinances required, the serving of such notices, the cost of construction, together with interest on notes or bonds issued in anticipation of the collection of deferred assessments and all other necessary expenditures.

Section 4. That the assessments so levies shall be paid in five equal annual installments with interest on deferred payments at the same rate as shall be borne by the bonds to be issued in anticipation of the collection theraps; provided that the owner of any property assessed, may at his option, pay such assessments in cash within thirty days after the passage of the assessment ordinance, upon the notice being given,

Section 5. That bonds shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of said assessments by installments, in a amount equal thereto.

Section 6. That the Clerk be, and hereby is, authorized to advertise for bids for the construction of said improvement, as provided by law.

Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
