

AN ORDINANCE NO. 740.

To amend Section (j) of Ordinance No. 450, being entitled, "An Ordinance No. 450 to regulate traffic on public highways of the Village of Bexley, Ohio, and to repeal all ordinances in conflict therewith," passed October 9th, 1923, and to provide for the designation of main thoroughfares in said Village.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That Section (j) of Ordinance No. 450, being entitled "An Ordinance No. 450 to regulate traffic on public highways of the Village of Bexley, Ohio, and to repeal all ordinances in conflict therewith," passed October 9th, 1923, be amended to read as follows:

"(j) That Broad Street and Main Street, from the west corporation line to the east corporation line, and Drexel Avenue, from Main Street to Broad Street, are hereby declared to be main thoroughfares. Except at intersecting main thoroughfares, or where a traffic officer or traffic signal light is stationed, vehicles on main thoroughfares shall have the right of way over those coming on intersecting thoroughfares, and all vehicles coming to a full stop before entering upon a main thoroughfare.

Subject to the foregoing provisions and the provisions of the preceding paragraph of this section, at all street intersections, including intersections of main thoroughfares, where no traffic officer or traffic signal light is stationed, vehicles and street cars approaching the crossing on the right and reaching the intersection of said streets at the same time or before those approaching from the left, shall have the right of way over the latter.


The Street Commissioner shall place appropriate signs at the intersections of said main thoroughfares with other thoroughfares as notice to the public of said main thoroughfares."

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.


