## AN ORDINANCE NO. 770.

By Mr. F. Bonnet.

To prohibit public dumps in the Village of Bexley, Chio.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY, STATE OF CHIO,

TWO-THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS ELECTED THERETO CONCURRING:

Section 1. That it shall be unlawfull for any person, being the owner, lessee, custodian, or person entitled to the possession of any lot, lots or lands in the Village of Bexley, Onio, to maintain the same as, or knowingly permit the same to be used as, a place whereon other persons, or the public generally, shall dump, throw, drop, deposit, or leave any waste paper, hay, straw, rags, stable manure, garbage, rubbish, decaying matter, vegetable or animal matter which may thereafter decompose, or other refuse matter of any description. This section shall not be construed to prohibit the dumping of earth, stone, or other matter that will not decay or emit noxious odors or create fire hazards.

Section 2. Any person violating any of the provisions of Section 1 of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined not less than \$5.00, nor more than \$25.00.

Section 3. That by reason of the fact that such place is being maintained within said Village, this ordinance is necessary for the immediate perservation of the public peace, health, and safety in said Village, and shall go into immediate effect.
