

AN ORDINANCE NO. 775

Amending Section 5 of an ordinance No. 450 to regulate traffic on the public highways of the Village of Bexley, Ohio, and to repeal all Ordinances in conflict therewith, passed on the 9th, day of October, 1923.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:


Section 1. That Section 5 of Ordinance No. 450, entitled, "An Ordinance No. 450 to regulate traffic on the public highways of the Village of Bexley, Ohio, and to repeal all ordinances in conflict therewith", passed on the 9th day of October, 1923, by amending to read as follows:

Section 5. SIGNALS; BELL, ETC--

- (a) Vehicles and street cars shall stop and move on signal from a traffic officer or traffic signal light where either one or the other is stationed.
- (b) Siren whistles or whistles operated by compressed air, condensed gas, exhaust gas or steam or other whistles shall not be used on any vehicle except those operated by the police and fire departments.
- (c) Drivers of vehicles before turning, stopping or changing their course shall make sure such movement can be made in safety and shall cause signals to be made of their intention in a way visible outside the vehicle.
- (d) In lieu of the above required signals appropriate signals may be given by any mechanical or electrical device which conveys an intelligent signal or warning to another vehicle approaching from the rear.
- (e) Provided further that a driver of a vehicle to whom a signal has been given shall keep his vehicle under such control as to be able to avoid an accident resulting from a misunderstanding of such signal.
- (f) An operator of a standing vehicle about to start shall give moving vehicles the right of way and shall give a timely and visible warning signal in some unmistakable manner before so starting; no vehicle shall start or pull away from the curb while a street car is passing abreast of such vehicle.
- (g) The driver of a vehicle shall give a timely and audible signal when overtaking a pedestrian on the street.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
