

AN ORDINANCE NO. 779.

Authorizing the borrowing of money and the issuing of notes of the Village of Bexley, Ohio, in anticipation of the levy of special assessments for the construction and installation of a system of lighting for certain streets and avenues in said Village.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Village of Bexley, Ohio, be and hereby is, authorized to borrow money in the sum of \$35,000.00, and to issue the notes of said Village therefor, in anticipation of the levy of special assessments and of the issue of bonds in anticipation of the collection of said assessments as provided by Section 3914 General Code, to pay that part of the cost heretofore determined to be specially assessed for the construction and the installation of a system of lighting for the following streets and avenues in said Village, to-wit:

- (a) Sheridan Avenue from Livingston Avenue to Main Street.
- (b) Dawson Avenue from Broad Street to Fair Avenue.
- (c) Cassady Avenue from Broad Street to Fair Avenue.
- (d) Ardmore Road from Broad Street to Fair Avenue.
- (e) Cassingham Road from Broad Street to Fair Avenue.
- (f) Fair Avenue from Drexel Avenue to south extension of Remington Road.
- (g) Bexford Place from Dawson Avenue to Cassady Avenue.
- (h) Powell Avenue from Dawson Avenue to Cassady Avenue.
- (i) Seneca Park Place from Dawson Avenue to Cassady Avenue.
- (j) Elm Avenue from Dawson Avenue to Cassady Avenue.
- (k) Dale Avenue from Dawson Avenue to Cassady Avenue.
- (l) Plymouth Avenue from Dawson Avenue to Cassady Avenue,

as provided by resolution No. 586, declaring the necessity therefor, adopted August 17th, 1926, and in pursuance of an Ordinance No. 777, determining to proceed with said improvement, passed September 17, 1926.

Section 2. That said notes shall be in denominations of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) each, or any multiple thereof, or such smaller denomination as may be necessary, shall be signed by the Mayor, attested by the Clerk, be sealed with the seal of the Village, bear date as issued and shall be due and payable not later than two years from date of issue. Said notes shall be numbered consecutively beginning with number one (1) and shall bear interest

at the lowest rate obtainable, but not in excess of 6% per annum, payable semi-annually. The proceeds of the bonds issued in anticipation of the collection of the assessments, and all of the assessments collected for said improvement, shall be applied to the payment of said notes and interest thereon until both are fully paid and thereafter said assessments shall be applied to the payment of said bonds and interest thereon.

Section 3. That the Finance Committee of this Council shall cause said notes to be properly prepared, executed and sold according to law to the person, persons, company or corporation offering the lowest rate of interest, and shall deposit the proceeds in the Village Treasury to the credit of _____ Fund.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
