

RESOLUTION NO. 677,

accepting the improvement of Chelsea Avenue from Livingston Avenue to Main Street and approving and ordering paid the final estimate thereon.

WHEREAS, pursuant to resolution of the Council of the Village of Bexley, a contract was entered into on the 18th day of October, 1927, between the Village and The A. E. Burns Construction Company, the receiver for The Yale Avenue Construction Company and The Globe Indemity Company, providing for the re-surfacing of certain portions of Chelsea Avenue and for the deposit of certain funds of the Village to guarantee said work, and

WHEREAS, The A. W. Burns Construction Company has re-surfaced said portions of said street to the satisfaction of the engineers and said engineers have certified the same to Council and have certified to Council the actual completion of said improvement and Council having satisfied itself as to the completion of the work of the contractor on said improvement, said improvement is hereby accepted and the Clerk is directed to issue notice of said acceptance to the receiver of the contractor, The Yale Avenue Construction Company, and

WHEREAS, the engineer has submitted to Council the final estimate of the amount of work done under the contract and the value thereof, showing the amount due the contractor, after deducting all previous payments and all amounts to be kept and retained under the provisions of the contract, in the sum of Two Thousand, Six Hundred Twenty-three Dollars and Thirty-five Cents (\$2,623.35) and Council having examined the same does hereby approve said estimate and order that same shall be paid as follows, to-wit: There having been liens filed against said fund in a total amount exceeding the amount of said final estimate as hereinafter set forth, and there being insufficient funds in the hands of said Village for the payment of said liens in full, it is ordered that said funds be apportioned pro-rata among said lien holders as provided by statute, said liens so filed being as follows, to-wit:

F. A. Hooper, Five Hundred Sixty-one Dollars Seventy Cents (\$561.70), with interest from December 9th, 1926, total amount, Five Hundred Ninety-two Dollars Fifty Cents (\$592.50);

A. W. Burns Construction Company, Nine Thousand, Five Hundred Forty-six Dollars Forty-four Cents (\$9,546.44);

Ohio Sand & Gravel Company, One Thousand, Five Hundred Ten Dollars Eighty-four Cents (\$1,510.84), with interest from December 4th, 1926, total Ninety amount, One Thousand, Five Hundred seven Dollars Forty-four Cents (\$1,597.44);

Alfred F. Riley and William Neilson, Six Hundred Forty-nine Dollars Thirty-two Cents (\$649.32), with interest from November 4th, 1926, total amount Six Hundred Eighty-eight Dollars Eighty-five Cents (\$688.85).

Be it further resolved that upon the release of record of their respective claims, the vouchers of the Village be issued to the above lien holders for the respective amounts due upon said respective claims as follows, to-wit:

F. A. Hooper, One Hundred Twenty-five Dollars Nine Cents (\$125.09).

A. W. Burns Construction Company, Two Thousand Fifteen Dollars Fifty-five Cents (\$2015.55).

Ohio Sand & Gravel Company, Three Hundred Thirty-seven Dollars Twenty-seven Cents (\$337.27).

Alfred F. Riley and William Neilson, One Hundred Forty-five Dollars Forty-four Cents (\$145.44).

This resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
