AN ORDINANCE NO. 804.

Authorizing the borrowing of additional money and the issuing of notes of the Village of Bexley in anticipation of the levy of special assessments for the construction of sanitary sewers in part of Sanitary Sewer District No. 5.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY, STATE OF CHIO:

Section 1. That, whereas, the Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) heretofore authorized to be borrowed by Ordinance No. 630, passed August 25th, 1925, in anticipation of the levy of special assessments for the construction of samitary sewers in part of Sanitary Sewer District No. 5 hereinafter described is insufficient to complete said construction and it is necessary to borrow an additional sum of Fifty-five Hundred Dollars (\$5500.00) therefor, said Village of Bexley, be, and hereby is, authorized to borrow an additional sum of Fifty-five Hundred Dollars (\$5500.00), and to issue the notes of said Village therefor, in anticipation of the levy of special assessments and the issu of bonds in anticipation of the collection of said assessments as provided by Section 3914 General Code, to pay the costs heretofore determined to be specially assessed for the construction of sanitary sewers in part of Sanitary Sewer District No. 5, as follows:

- (a) An eight (8) inch sewer in the alley north of Livingston Avenue from the alley east of Chelsea Avenue to Roche Avenue.
 - (b) An eight (8) inch sewer in the alley east of Grandon Avenue from the alley north of Livingston Avenue to the alley south of Main Street.
 - (c) An eight (8) inch sewer in the alley east of Roosevelt Avenue from the alley north of Livingston Avenue to the alley south of Main Street.
 - (d) An eight (8) inch sewer in the alley east of Vernon Road from the alley north of Livingston Avenue to Astor Avenue.
 - An eight (8) inch sewer in the alley east of Roche Avenue from the alley north of Livingston Avenue to Astor Avenue.
 - (f) An eight (8) inch sewer in the alley south of Main Street from the alley east of Chelsea Avenue to Roosevelt Avenue,

as provided by Resolution No. 476, declaring the necessity therefor, adopted

June 9th, 1925, and in pursuance of an Ordinance No. 623, determining to proceed with said improvement, passed July 28th, 1925.

Section 2. That said notes shall be in denominations of One
Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) each, or any multiple thereof, or such smaller
denomination as may be necessary, shall be signed by the Mayor, attested
by the Clerk, be sealed with the seal of the Village, bear date as
issued and shall be due and payable not later than two years from date of
issue. Said notes shall be numbered consecutively beginning with number
one (1) and shall bear interest at the lowest rate obtainable, but not
in excess of 6% per annum, payable semi-annually. The proceeds of the
bonds issued in anticipation of the collection of the assessments, and
all of the assessments collected for said improvement, shall be applied
to the payment of said notes and interest thereon until both are fully
paid, and thereafter said assessments shall be applied to the payment
of said bonds and interest thereon.

Section 3. That the Finance Committee of this Council shall cause said notes to be properly prepared, executed and sold according to law to the person, persons, company or corporation offering the lowest rate of interest, and shall deposit the proceeds in the Village Treasury to the credit of Sundry Section Improvement Fund.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and le in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
