AN ORDINANCE NO. 849.

Granting permission to Kenneth C. Browne and Norma G. Browne to tap sanitary sewer in the alley between Bryden Road and Sherwood Road and west of Remington Road.

WHEREAS, Kenneth C. Browne and Norma G. Browne, the owners of Lot Number Forty-three (43) of Bexley Highlands Addition in the Village of Bexley, located at the southeast corner of Bryden Road and Remington Road, have petitioned for permission to tap the sanitary sewer west of Remington Road and in the alley between Bryden And Sherwood Roads for the sewerage of the dwelling house which they are constructing upon said lot and have signed in writing a waiver on behalf of themselves, their heirs and assigns, agreeing with the Village that when that part of the system of sewerage, designed, or to be designed, by said Village shall be constructed in the akley east of Reminston Road between Bryden and Sherwood Roads, said above described premises may be assessed for its proper proportion of the cost of such sewer, and therein waiving the right to claim exemption from such assessments on the ground that said premises already have or may have adequate sewerage, and therein agreeing that said Village may, in case it so desires, tap into or extend said sewer without cost, NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That said Kenneth C. Browne and Norma G. Browne, in consideration of said waiver and said agreement are hereby granted permission to tap into said sanitary sewer now located in the alley between Bryden Road and Sherwood Road and west of Lemington Road for the sewerage of the dwelling house now being constructed upon said Lot No. 43 of Bexley Highlands Addition and to lay at their own expense and under the supervision of the Street Commissioner of the Village of Bexley, the necessary sewer line to connect said premises therewith and to restore the surface of any streets disturbed to the satisfaction of said Street Commissioner.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
