AN ORDINANCE NO. 856.

To amend Section 1 of Ordinance No. 547, entitled "An Ordinance No. 547, to fix the salaries, compensation and bonds of Village Officials and employees, and to repeal Ordinances No. 459, passed November 27th, 1923, and No. 493, passed April 15th, 1924, respectively".

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the salary of the Mayor of the Village shall be One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per annum and he shall give bond in the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00). All fines and costs collected in the Mayor's court in Criminal cases shall be paid into the Village Treasury.

Section 2. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency ordinance, and to be necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace and safety in said Village; the reason for such necessity being that the existing ordinance provides that the salary of the Mayor shall be \$100.00 per annum, "in addition to the fees and other compensation now or hereafter provided by law." included in which fees and other compensation now provided by law is the provision that the Mayor shall receive fees and costs in misdemeanor cases tried before him, whereas, a recent decision of the Supreme Court of the United States has decided, in effect that such participationiin fees and costs by a presiding Court renders such Court incompetent and without jurisdiction to hear such cases, thus creating such emergency that the Village is without power to enforce its ordinances or to punish violations thereof, thereby endangering the public peace and safety of the Village.

Section 3. This ordinance shall go into immediate effect.
