

Ordinance No. 870.

To provide for three additional deputy marshalls in the
Village of Bexley, Ohio

Be it ordained by the Council of the Village of Bexley,
State of Ohio:

Section 1. That the offices of three deputy marshalls in
addition to the deputy marshalls heretofore established by ordinance be, and
the same are hereby, created and established; that the Mayor, subject to the
confirmation of Council be, and hereby is empowered to appoint annually three
suitable persons as such deputy marshalls of the village for such period of
time, not to exceed one year, as the Mayor may determine to be necessary; that
the salary of said additional deputy marshalls shall be One Hundred Thirty-
five Dollars (\$135.00) per month; and such deputy marshalls shall give bond
according to law in the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00).


Section 2. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be
an emergency ordinance and necessary for the immediate preservation of the
public peace and safety within the Village of Bexley, and is made necessary
by the recent increase and prevalence of burglaries and other forms of crime
within the Village.

Section 3. That said first appointments shall become
effective October 1st, 1927, and shall be for the remainder of the year,
1927, and thereafter annually, subject to the foregoing provisions and of the
statutes.

Section 4. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in
force from and after its passage.
