

RESOLUTION NO. 701.

By Mr. Manly.

Declaring it necessary to improve Dawson Avenue from Main Street to Fair Avenue.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That it is necessary to improve Dawson Avenue between Main Street and Fair Avenue, in said Village, by grading, curbing and paving the roadway thereof with brick, asphalt, concrete or someother form of permanent improvement, and constructing the necessary sewers or drains to furnish proper drainage for such improvement and erecting street signs, also constructing cement sidewalks on both sides thereof, in accordance with the plans, specifications, estimates and profiles heretofore filed with this Council, which are hereby approved.

Section 2. That the grade of said Dawson Avenue as improved shall be the grade shown by and upon the plans and profiles aforesaid and the grade of the curbs shall be as follows, to-wit:

EAST CURB-

Beginning at the north line of Main Street, Station 0+00 and elevation 101.00; thence northerly with a 0.39% ascending grade to the south line of Sherwood Road, Station 3+37.18 and elevation 102.32; thence northerly to the north line of Sherwood Road, Station 3+97.18 and elevation 102.45; thence northerly with a 0.51% ascending grade to the south line of Bryden Road, Station 6+98.77 and elevation 103.99; thence northerly to the north line of Bryden Road, Station 7+78.77 and elevation 104.00; thence northerly with a 1.56% ascending grade to Station 9+00 and elevation 105.89; thence northerly with a vertical curve to Station 9+80 and elevation 106.22; thence northerly with a 0.45% descending grade to the south line of Bexley Park Road, Station 10+75.74 and elevation 105.70; thence northerly to the north line of Bexley Park Road, Station 11+55.74 and elevation 105.70; thence northerly with a 0.54% ascending grade to the south line of Brentwood Road, Station 14+52.71 and elevation 107.30; thence northerly to the north line of Brentwood Road, Station 15+12.71 and elevation 107.40; thence northerly with a 0.30% descending grade to Station 16+46 and elevation 107.00; thence northerly with a 0.36% ascending grade to the south line of Fair Avenue, Station 18+09.68 and elevation 107.59.

WEST CURB-

The elevation of the west curb to be the same as that of the east curb.

Section 3. That the whole cost of said improvement, less one-third (1/3) thereof and the cost of intersections, shall be specially assessed in proportion to the benefits which may result from said improvement upon the following described lots and lands, to-wit: All of the lots and lands bounding,

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fronting and abutting upon said improvement, which lots and lands hereby are determined to be specially benefitted by said improvement and in the amount equal to that part of the cost thereof hereby determined to be assessed thereon.

Section 4. That the special assessments so to be levied shall be paid in not less than nine or more than ten equal annual installments with interest on the deferred payments at the same rate as shall be borne by the bonds to be hereafter issued in anticipation of the collection of such assessments.

Section 5. That said Village may borrow money and issue notes due and payable not later than two years from date of issue, in anticipation of the levy of said assessments and of the issuance of bonds in anticipation of the collection of said special assessments as provided in Section 3914 of the General Code, said notes shall not exceed in amount that portion of the estimated cost of the improvement for which said assessments are to be levied.

Section 6. That bonds of said village shall be issued, in anticipation of the collection of said assessments, in an amount sufficient to pay that portion of the estimated cost of said improvement hereinbefore determined to be assessed upon the property fronting and abutting thereon.

Section 7. That the village's portion of the cost of said improvement shall be paid from the proceeds of bonds, issued by said village in the manner provided by law.

Section 8. That Resolution No. 647, adopted June 14th, 1927, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Section 9. That this resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
