## RESOLUTION NO. 709.

By Mr. Manly.

Declaring it necessary to improve Remington Road from Powell Avenue to Elm Avenue.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That it is necessary to improve Remington Road from the north line of Powell Avenue to the south curb line of Elm Avenue extended, as follows: By grading, curbing and paving the roadway thereof with brick, asphalt, concrete or someother form of permanent improvement, constructing the necessary sewers or drains to furnish proper drainage for said improvement from the south curb line of Elm Avenue extended, to a point approximately one hundred and seventy-four (174) feet south of the south line of Powell Avenue; by widening the paved portion of said street to thirty (30) feet between a point approximately one hundred and seventy-four (174) feet south of the south line of Powell Avenue to the north line of Powell Avenue by setting back the curb and gutter three (3) feet on each side and paving said widened portion of said roadway to conform to the existing improvement and making the necessary changes in drains to provide proper drainage for said improvement; also by constructing sidewalks on both sides of said street from the south curb line of Elm Avenue endended to the south line of Powell Avenue, and erecting street signs; all in accordance with the plans, specifications, estimates and profiles heretofore filed with this council which are hereby approved.

Section 2. That the grade of said Remington Road as improved shall be the grade shown by and upon the plans and profiles aforesaid and the grade of the curb shall be as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at Station 0.65 and elevation 113.58, (0.00 being the south line of Elm Avenue); thence northerly with a 0.24% ascending grade to station 2.20 and elevation 113.95; thence northerly with a 0.33% descending grade to the south line of Powell Avenue, station 4.25.45 and elevation 113.27.

Beginning at station 0+35 and elevation 113.51, (0+00 being the south line of Elm Avenue); hence northerly with a 0.24% ascending grade to

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station 2.20 and elevation 113.95; thence northerly 0.35% descending grade to the south line of Powell Avenue, station 4.25.45 and elevation 113.27.

section 5. That the Village shall pay the entire cost of widening said road from the north line of Powell Avenue to a point approximately one hundred and seventy-four (174) feet south of the south line of Powell Avenue, and the balance of the cost of said improvement hereinabove provided, less two per cent (2%) and the cost of intersections, shall be specially assessed in proportion to the benefits which may result from said improvement upon the following described lots and lands, to-wit: All of the lots and lands bounding, fronting and abutting upon said improvement, which said lots and lands hereby are determined to be specially benefitted by said improvement and in the amount equal to that part of the cost hereof hereby determined to be assessed thereon.

Section 4. That the special assessment so to be levied shall be paid in not less than nine or more than ten equal annual installments with interest on the deferred payments at the same rate as shall be borne by the bonds to be hereafter issued in anticipation of the collection of such assessments.

Section 5. That said Village may borrow money and issue notes due and payable not later than two years from date of issue, in anticipation of the levy of said assessments and of the issuance of bonds in anticipation of the collection of said special assessments as provided in Section 2293-24 of the General Code, said notes shall not exceed in amount that portion of the estimated cost of the improvement for which said assessments are to be levied.

issued, in anticipation of the collection of said assessments, in an amount sufficient to pay that portion of the estimated cost of said improvement hereinbefore determined to be assessed upon the property fronting and abutting thereon.

Section 7. That the village's portion of the cost of said improvement shall be paid from the proceeds of bonds,



issued by said village in the manner provided by law.

Section 8. This resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earlist period allowed by law.
