

RESOLUTION NO. 713.

To provide for lighting certain streets in the Village of Bexley, Ohio, and for levying and collecting special assessments therefor.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That it is hereby declared to be necessary to provide for lighting the following streets, roads and avenues in the Village of Bexley, Ohio, by laying under-ground cables, erecting light standards, installing lamps, conduits and other necessary equipment in accordance with the plans, specifications and estimates for said system of lighting now on file in the office of the Village Clerk, which are hereby approved, to-wit:

- (a) Maryland Avenue from Drexel Avenue to Cassady Road.
- (b) Cassady Road from Broad Street to Maryland Avenue.
- (c) Ardmore Road from Broad Street to Maryland Avenue.
- (d) Cassingham Road from Broad Street to Maryland Avenue.
- (e) Remington Road from Elm Avenue to Maryland Avenue.
- (f) Stanwood Road from Powell Avenue to Broad Street.
- (g) Powell Avenue from Stanwood Road to Gould Road.
- (h) Elm Avenue from Cassady Road to Remington Road.
- (i) Havenwood Drive South from Euclaire Avenue to Cassingham Road.
- (j) Cassingham Road from Main Street to Charles Street.
- (k) Montrose Avenue from Main Street to Charles Street.
- (l) Remington Road from Main Street to first alley south of Astor Avenue.
- (m) Vernon Road from Main Street to first alley south of Astor Avenue.
- (n) Roosevelt Avenue from Main Street to first alley south of Astor Avenue.
- (o) Chelsea Avenue from Main Street to Charles Street.

Section 2. That the entire cost of constructing and installing said system for lighting said streets and avenues, except one-fiftieth (1/50) thereof, shall be specially assessed in proportion to the benefits which may result from said improvements on all the lots and lands bounding, fronting, and abutting upon said proposed

improvements between the points aforesaid, which said lots and lands are hereby determined to be specially benefited by said improvement, and in an amount equal to that part of the cost thereof hereby determined to be assessed thereon.

Section 3. That the assessments so to be levied shall be paid in five equal annual installments with interest on the deferred payments at the same rate as shall be borne by the bonds to be hereafter issued in anticipation of the levy and of the collection of such assessments.

Section 4. That bonds of said village shall be issued in anticipation of the levy and of the collection of said assessments, in an amount sufficient to pay the estimated cost of said improvement.


Section 5. That the Village's portion of the cost of said improvement shall be paid from the proceeds of bonds issued by said Village in the manner provided by law.

Section 6. The notice of the adoption of this resolution shall be given to the owners of the lots and lands to be assessed for the payment of the cost and expense of such lighting, by publication thereof in a newspaper printed in Ohio and of general circulation in the village, for the period of fifteen days prior to the taking effect thereof.


Section 7. This resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
