## AN ORDINANCE NO. 924.

Determining to proceed with the improvement of Fair Avenue at the intersection with Drexel Avenue, by widening the roadway thereof.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BENLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That it is hereby determined to proceed with the improvement of Fair Avenue at the intersection of Drewel Avenue by widening same to the sidth of approximately 62 feet by resetting the curbing, grading, curbing and paving the roadway thereof with asphalt and make the necessary changes in drains, in accordance with a Resolution No. 704, declaring it necessary to improve said street, adopted February 14th, 1928, and in accordance with the plans, specifications, estimates and profiles heretofore approved and now on file in the office of the Village Clerk.

Section 2. That all claims for damages resulting from said improvement shall be judicially inquired into after the completion of the improvement, and the solicitor is hereby authorized and directed to institute proceedings in a court of competent jurisdiction to inquire into such claims.

Section 3. That the whole cost of said improvement shall be paid by the Village from bonds issued by said Village in the manner provided by law.

Section 4. That the Clerk be and hereby is authorized and directed to advertise for bids for the construction of said improvement according to law.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force
