

ORDINANCE NO. 936.

Providing for the cutting of noxious weeds in the Village of Bexley, Ohio.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. Upon information that noxious weeds are growing on any lots or lands in the Village of Bexley and are about to spread or mature seeds, the Clerk shall cause a written notice to be served upon the owner, lessee, agent or tenant having charge of such lots or lands, notifying him that said noxious weeds are growing thereon and that they must be cut and destroyed within five days after the service of such notice. If such owner or other person having charge of such lands is a non-resident whose address is known, such notice shall be sent to his address by registered mail; if the address of such owner is unknown it shall be sufficient to publish such notice once in a newspaper of general circulation in the county.

Section 2. A Marshal or police officer or the Clerk of the Village or his deputy may make service and return of the notice provided in the next preceding section and the fees therefore shall be the same as are allowed for service and return of summons in civil cases before the Mayor.

Section 3. If the owner, lessee, agent or tenant having charge of the lands mentioned in Section 1 herein, fails to comply with such notice, Council shall cause said noxious weeds to be cut and destroyed and may employ the necessary labor to carry out the provisions of this section. All expenses incurred shall, when approved by Council, be paid out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated.

Section 4. Council, through the Clerk, shall make a written return to the County Auditor of this county of its action under the next preceding sections with a statement of the charges for such services, the amount paid for the performing of such labor and the fees of the officers who made the service of the notice and return and a proper description of the premises. Such amounts when allowed shall be entered upon the tax duplicate and be a lien upon such lands from and after the date of the entry and be collected as other taxes and returned to the Village with the general fund.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
