## ORDINANCE NO. 950.

WHEREAS, the trees, shrubberies and plants in Commonwealth Commons, or park, located in the Village of Bexley, are diseased or becoming diseased and require the immediate attention of an expert, and

whereas, H.M.Hansen Jrhas made an examination of said trees, shrubberies and plants and proposes to undertake to di, perform and over-see the necessary labor to treat said trees, shrubberies and plants and put same in a first class and healthy condition for the sum of One Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$1.50) per hour for his time and labor, he to be furnished with necessary helpers, or laborers, by the Street Commissioner, and

WHEREAS, Council is of the opinion that said work is necessary and should be undertaken immediately for the preservation of said plants,

NOT, THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BEXLEY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That H. M. Hansen Jr. be, and heris hereby, employed to do the necessary triming, spraying, treating and transplanting trees, shrubberies and other plants in said Common-wealth Commons to put the same in a healthy and first class condition, he using and furnishing such tools and equipment as he now has and as he customarily furnishes in his work, and that he be paid therefor the sum of One Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$1.50) per hour but not to exceed the total sum of Four Hundred and Ninety Dollars (\$490.00), which sum of \$490.00 is hereby appropriated for said purpose from the Park Fund, C 11-appropriate in the Service Fund.

Section 2. That the Street Commissioner be, and hereby is, authorized to furnish and employ necessary helpers to assist in the above work and that same be paid not to exceed Fifty-five Cents (55¢) per hour for such services.

Section 3. That said work be done under the direction of the Park Committee of Council and of the Street Commissioner and to their satisfaction.

Section 4. This ordinance is an emergency ordinance and is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety and shall go into immediate force and effect.
